Foreword

In this edition of Mv Mansfield you will be able to find out about the new Mansfield Health Partnership which I was pleased to launch last month.

It is just one of the ways that Mansfield District Council is working hard to tackle its corporate challenges around Place. Growth, Aspiration and Wellbeing,

Influential organisations, including the county council's Public Health team, Active Nottinghamshire and health service representatives, such as local GPs and Clinical Commissioning Group, attended the partnership launch and made commitments to tackle this area's health inequalities.

This is just the start. Going forward, we will concentrate on bringing tangible improvements to the areas of Mansfield and those residents that most need help.

We're also working to tackle the district's housing needs and this month the council will consider a major new plan to



build another 150 council homes which would, if agreed, be a welcome addition to existing plans for 100 council homes over the coming five years.

Look out for lots more exciting plans for Mansfield in the coming months as we bid for £50m of Government funds to revitalise our town centre.

We are already making progress on town centre improvements with the start of the five-year Townscape Heritage Project.

Meanwhile we are getting ready for the reopening of the Old Town Hall after a £1.4m refurbishment. It looks fantastic after its internal facelift and it will be great to see this beautiful building being used again and achieving its potential.

Plans to build another 150 council homes



Councillors are set to consider plans to build another 150 affordable council homes to rent. The Full Council is scheduled to consider the scheme on 26 November.

The scheme would add to existing plans agreed by the council last year, for the authority to build more than 100 new council homes over the next five years at a cost of £21.4m.

The new homes would help to address the district's housing needs as set out in the proposed new Local Plan, which is expected to be formally adopted by the council next

Working together to improve wellbeing



Action to tackle health inequalities in the district is being spearheaded by the council with the launch of the Mansfield Health Partnership.

Supported by agencies responsible for wellbeing across Nottinghamshire, the partnership aims to set out a long-term action plan to address health issues in the district where life expectancy in some neighbourhoods is ten years below the national average.

The partnership is due to hold its first meeting before the end of the year.

Extra four police officers for district

Four extra police officers, including one funded by the council, have now joined the beat in Mansfield district - two of them dedicated to Mansfield town centre.

Nottinghamshire Police had already planned to provide three new officers for the district and the council agreed to pay for a fourth - PC Nathan Robinson - to patrol the town centre.

PC Robinson has already become a familiar face in the town and is settling into his new position.

David Evans, Head of Health and Communities at the council, said: "We hope this will help to reassure our residents, businesses and visitors of our commitment to keep the town centre and the surrounding district a safe and welcoming place."

The town centre policing team is also due to have a presence in the newly-refurbished Old Town Hall when it re-opens.



Help for the homeless

You can also help efforts to support rough sleepers here by donating time or items to one of the many organisations that work with them.

A seven-night-a-week shelter provided by the council in partnership with local churches and Derby City Mission, is due to open from 9 December to the end of March.

This provision goes beyond the severe weather shelter that the council is obliged to provide when temperatures are forecast to dip below freezing for three nights or more in succession.

New youth worker for Mansfield

A new Youth Partnership Co-ordinator is helping to tackle anti-social behaviour involving young people in the district.

The council has been awarded funding of £37,000 from the Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner to employ the officer until the end of the financial year.

The role will help ensure that the council and other organisations are tapping into all the available resources to support vulnerable young people in the district.

Elaine Quince, the council's Community Safety Manager, said: "It will be an exciting and challenging new project with a diverse range of aims, not least the reduction of anti-social behaviour."

Order renewed to curb anti-social behaviour

Mansfield District Council has renewed an order to reinforce the safety of its parks and the town centre.

A Public Spaces Protection Order, which has been in force in the district for the past three years, has now been renewed following a public consultation.

It aims to tackle issues such as smoking in play areas, drinking alcohol in parks and restricts cycling through the pedestrianised area of the town centre.



Possible £50m boost for Mai

Mansfield could be in line to receive a total of more than £50m in Government funding to develop innovative regeneration plans.

The district is among 100 places invited to develop proposals for a new generation of multi-million-pound Town Deals.

The areas eligible for up to £25m in support from the Government's £3.6 billion Towns Fund include places with proud industrial and economic heritage but which have not always benefited from economic growth in the same way as more prosperous areas.

Community leaders in Mansfield are now expected to join forces to draw up ambitious plans, focusing on improved transport, broadband connectivity, skills and culture.

The invitation to bid for Town Deal money comes after the district was also



granted £150,000 to work on detailed masterplans for the town centre as part of a bid for up to £25m to be made to Government's Future High Streets Fund by spring 2020.

Mike Robinson, Strategic Director at the council, said: "The masterplan will enable us to examine how we rise to the challenges presented by changes in the way people do their shopping and use their town centres.

Revamping heritage gems

Heritage properties in the town centre had a free gutter clean recently as a major five-year scheme, Mansfield Townscape Heritage Project, was launched.

Working for Warsop

We are disappointed our bid was not successful but we are continuing to look at other ways to bring regeneration to this area.

of several council projects to revitalise the town centre that are already underway, including a £1.4m refurbishment of Old Town Hall, which is nearing completion, and a £2.4m project to improve the appearance of Walkden Street car park, which is due to start in the autumn.

Meanwhile Mansfield Townscape Heritage Project, which benefited from nearly £850,000 of National Lottery Heritage Fund grants, to renovate properties in parts of Leeming Street, the Market Place and Stockwell Gate was launched recently.

Hotel plans moving forward

Detailed plans are being drawn up for the redevelopment of the former Mansfield bus station site on Stockwell Gate North, with a planning application expected to be submitted by the end of this year or early in 2020.

Two international hotel brands have confirmed interest and support in the redevelopment of the site, one of the main gateways into the town centre.

The scheme involves major investment from various sources including Mansfield District Council and the developer, ARBA Property Group.

Old Town Hall set to reopen

Renovation work on the Old Town Hall is nearing completion and the council expects the building to be open in the new year.

Work on the Grade II* listed building began a year ago and its £1.4m revamp will bring the Old Town Hall back into full use for the first time in more than 30 years.

The property has been made more accessible, been redecorated, restoring original features, and has had a full revamp of its heating and electrics. It is hoped the scheme will create at least 20 jobs in five ground-floor level retail units and offices on the first and second floors. Many local businesses and apprentices have also been used during the restoration.

Planning blueprint to be made official

Mansfield District Council is hoping to be in a position to adopt its new Local Plan early next year.

The document, which officially sets out the planning blueprint for the district until 2033, was submitted to the Secretary of State in December 2018.

The council expects to receive a letter from the inspectorate before the end of the year, giving the go-ahead to the authority to formally adopt the Plan.

The Plan sets out things like where new housing and industrial buildings can be built and how local planning policies will protect green spaces.

Gypsy sites plan moves to next stage

The council has been obliged by the Government to draw up a separate Development Plan to provide four sites to accommodate the gypsy, traveller and the travelling showpeople community.

A consultation with the public was held between July and September to consider 15 potential locations.

The next stage is to publish the Publication draft version of the plan early next year, which will set out which locations the council considers are the most suitable and will allow residents to make further representations on the preferred sites.

Council homes up for top award

All our fingers and toes are crossed after our Town View development of 54 homes for the over-55s was shortlisted for a major award.

The £9.1m complex is in the final for the Best Older Person's Development category for developments of more than 50 homes, in the prestigious Inside Housing Development Awards 2019.

The winners will be announced on 27 November.

The awards are an opportunity to celebrate the very best residential developments across the UK from the past year.

The Town View senior person's living scheme has 42 apartments and 12 bungalows for over 55s, six of which are in shared ownership.

The secure gated development, set around a "village green" garden, with outdoor fitness equipment, includes ten apartments provided through Nottinghamshire County Council Adult Social Care that aim to enable older people, needing additional support, to live independently for longer.

Work set to start on modular homes



Work will soon begin on a scheme to build ten council houses at Rosemary Avenue in Mansfield.

Contractors are scheduled to be on site before Christmas and the four, threebedroom and six, two-bedroom homes are expected to be ready for tenants to move into in early spring.

The construction of the homes is being completed much quicker than usual because, for the first time, the council is using modular housing.

These houses are manufactured in a factory and then delivered in large pieces that are effectively slotted into place on site.



Show home for executive houses

A show home was set to open as My Mansfield went to print at Wildflower Rise, the development of 23 executive homes being built near Carr Bank Park in Mansfield.

Work on the site should be complete next month with the homes being sold shortly after.

The four and five-bedroom detached houses are being developed by Mansfield District Council's arm's length property development company, Mansfield Homes Ltd.

The venture was set up to build homes on surplus council land as a way of generating income to help support services for local people in the face of dwindling Government grants.

The luxury Wildflower Rise properties range in price from £415,000 to £540,000. The houses are being marketed by Burchell Edwards estate agents in Mansfield.



Berry Hill Park future looks secure Mansfield District Council has secured the future of Berry Hill Park by becoming a Corporate Trustee.

This means that the council is now legally responsible for the maintenance, safety and development of the park. A similar arrangement operates at the Racecourse Park in Mansfield.

The Berry Hill Park land will remain in the ownership of the Official Custodian for Charities but the council will be responsible for managing and running the park.

The council first stepped in to support efforts to keep the park open a year ago when it entered into an interim service level agreement with the park trustees.

This agreement included carrying out general maintenance such as litter

picking, emptying bins, grass cutting, clearing leaves and repairs, including safety work on trees and the play area.

It is expected that the council and Friends of Berry Hill Park will work together on future community schemes in the park.

The sessions, on Wednesdays from 9am to 10am, are open to anyone but as this time is generally guieter, it has been designated dementia-friendly hour.


All staff who support the sessions have completed Dementia Friends training.
