Comments and questions noted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Less footfall than expected on the route from the Bus station in to the town centre. High footfall from the Stockwell Gate and Westgate end, which could suggest a hotel site and residential area respectively. • Why do people visit the town? Why do they stay, and what is required to encourage more

Suggested to look at the current trends and feed into this.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mobile App for the projects, or a high social media presence for the projects when agreed and awarded to encourage interest and visits. • Look at the large demographic of younger residents, what are their needs and requirements. • Look at what data and information partners around the table can provide, ask questions in their sectors to feed into the work stream groups. • Look at behavioural tracking, reach of the town appears to be from the immediate area – local to Mansfield. Why don't people come in to the town from outside and do they go anywhere else? How do we get them into the town? • Connect with ARUP.
