



Berry Hill Park has a rich history. The landscape was first designed to complement Berry Hill Hall but in the 20th century, the site became strongly associated with the Miners Welfare Association. Mansfield Harriers has also been based at Berry Hill since the 1950's. The park design will record, celebrate and explain all of these different strands of history.


