We know the past year has been tough and reaching out to support people in need has been a major part of the council's agenda. Read more about our Feeding Mansfield project on page 8.



Supporting you through COVID-19

It's hard to believe it's been 16 months since the first national lockdown started.

We've been working extremely hard, alongside our partners, to provide help for those who need it most. If you need support visit www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk.

We supported the local NHS to open the Mansfield Vaccination Centre at the former Wickes site and helped to provide suitable locations for testing centres.

Our Environmental Health team is continuing to work closely with the county council's Public Health team, Public Health England and the Health and Safety Executive to investigate outbreaks, provide advice, carry out checks and enforcement - where necessary.

Our dedicated Covid Marshals, financed by the Government's Contain funding, and High Street Ambassadors, funded by the European Union's Regional Development Fund, are helping the public and businesses to comply with quidelines. This has helped visitors to return with confidence to support our local businesses.

NHS App

Use the NHS App to share your COVID-19 status, order repeat prescriptions, book and manage appointments and get health information and advice.

Vaccinations



The COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective and the best way to protect yourself and others.

Research shows they:

- significantly reduce your risk of getting seriously ill or dying from COVID-19.
- reduce your risk of getting symptoms, and
- will help reduce your risk of catching and spreading COVID-19.

Don't forget you need two doses for stronger and longer-lasting protection.

After vaccination, continue to do twice-weekly rapid tests and follow all the guidance as you could still get or spread COVID-19.

If you have any of these symptoms, get a PCR test as soon as possible:

- a high temperature
- a new. continuous cough
- you've lost your sense of smell or taste or it's changed

You can order a PCR test kit to be delivered to your home or book an appointment at a test site.

If you have symptoms, you and anyone you live with must immediately self-isolate.

Multi-million pound boost for district

The Making Mansfield Place Board, made up of representatives from a wide range of partner organisations, has selected six projects that are set to benefit from the £12.3m Towns Fund.

They are:

Destination Mansfield: investment in new facilities at Berry Hill Park, improved links to King George V park, links to national cycle routes and openair events space to attract visitors.

Mansfield Woodhouse

micro-technology units: the creation of business incubation units at Mansfield Woodhouse Station Gateway.

Smart Mansfield: an infrastructure network across the town, which could be used to support a range of activities in the future. This could include providing electronic signs to direct motorists to places of interest along with signs that provide information about available parking spaces in real time to help people reach their destination more easily. This will be subject to further consultation.

Destination Mansfield branding programme: the creation of a new brand for the district, supported by an annual programme of public events.

A future technology skills and knowledge exchange centre at Vision West Nottinghamshire College's **Chesterfield Road site:**

It would deliver new courses in modern technology such as electric vehicle design and maintenance, and offer opportunities for local businesses to benefit from the technological expertise of both the college and Nottingham Trent University, as well as their networks of industrial partnerships to help them create well-paid jobs in Mansfield.

Warsop Health Hub at Carr Lane Park: a 15m x 8m swimming pool, changing village, fitness suite, community and office space, multipurpose dividable hall, café, viewing and reception area.

The total value of the six projects is £17,680,000 with additional funding of £5,380,000 still to be confirmed.

The Place Board will now develop detailed business cases to ensure that these projects deliver the positive impact that we all want to achieve.

The final projects are expected to be delivered between 2022 and 2026.

The World-Famous Mexican-inspired restaurant brand, will bring

jobs to the town centre

> Taco Bell, the world-famous **Mexican-inspired restaurant** brand, will bring 30 jobs to the town centre.

The new leisure development will also be home to Tim Hortons, a Canadian brand, which has been expanding across the UK since 2017.

It specialises in premium coffee, freshly baked goods, sandwiches, wraps, and breakfast snacks.

Domino's will relocate from across the road to a new purpose-built building.

HOTEL MAKES ROOM FOR NEW JOBS The former bus station site is being transformed into a 100-bed hotel with space for three major food brands by local property developer ARBA Property Group. COFFEE

The plans centre on a new six-storey, nationally-branded, 100-bedroom hotel with breakfast lounge, car parking spaces, direct pedestrian access to the adjacent Walkden Street car park, and revamped pedestrian links to the Four Seasons Shopping Centre.

The scheme has been made possible largely thanks to a £668,388 grant from the N2 Town Centres Programme. following a rigorous evaluation process. The programme is administered by Nottinghamshire County Council on behalf of the D2N2 Local Enterprise Partnership. The crucial funding has helped plug a viability gap identified in the development and allowed it to move forward.

Redevelopment of this key gateway site will mean a boost for jobs and the local economy by encouraging more people to spend more time and more money in the town centre.

The area's appearance has already improved with the completion of new geometric cladding on Walkden Street multi-storey car park. The previous concrete panels had reached the end of their natural life and were a potential danger. The new cladding allows better ventilation and natural light into the car park, which benefits from extra-wide bays, ideal for those with children or who drive larger vehicles.

Masterplan

Work is progressing on the town centre masterplan, which is being prepared on behalf of the council by consultants Allies and Morrison. At the time of writing a consultation draft is being worked on ready for your views.

Funding floods to town

We're pleased that Mansfield will benefit from a £82m Severn Trent pilot scheme to reduce flood risk.

The project is among a national programme aimed at helping the UK's green economy bounce back and will create new jobs. The innovative project, which will benefit both local communities and the environment, will use a nature-based approach to reduce the risk of flooding whilst creating a green environment.

Business support

The council's financial support available for enterprises in the Mansfield district includes:

Business Start-Up Grant:

Up to £2,500 to help start a business and for costs such as buying equipment, stationery, website design and marketing.

Business Growth Grant:

Up to £2.500 to help established businesses with a viable growth plan that demonstrates potential job creation.

Shop Front Improvement Grant:

Up to £2,500 for independent retailers which want to make alterations or repairs to their shop front.

Vacant Shops Grant:

Up to £2,500 for independent retailers taking occupation of a vacant property to help pay for costs such as improvements to the premises, fixtures and fittings, rental payments, insurance, advertising and marketing.

Discretionary Business Rate Relief:

Up to 75% relief over two years is available for small to medium sized businesses. To be eligible, they must be either established high growth businesses in Mansfield or wishing to locate to the district and must occupy new premises with a rateable value greater than £51,000 a year.

Wellbeing



Sadly, coronavirus brought more than just lockdown to our district. As many people's circumstances have changed, some have been faced with hard choices such as whether food or fuel are more important.



Mansfield District Council has been working with two leading national charities, Family Action and FareShare to open six food clubs to encourage affordable yet nutritious meals in the most affected areas.

Along with our partners Feeding Britain, we secured £77,000 funding from Nottinghamshire County Council's Emergency Assistance Fund to develop the support needed for our communities and FOOD clubs were born.

So, what is a food club?

Food On Our Doorstep (FOOD) clubs provide families with good-quality food at a low cost, while also reducing food waste.

How do I get involved?

It costs just £1 a year for a family to become a member. Once you've joined, you can purchase a bag of tasty food items every week worth up to £15 for just

£3.50! (You must live or work within 15 minutes of the club you would like to join.)

For many people the district's six food clubs have offered more than just food. For some it has provided a rare opportunity to leave the house and take a short walk to get essential ingredients without the stress of using public transport and queuing to go in shops.

As the clubs grow in popularity and size, look out for exciting expansion plans that are in the pipeline, including the launch of a Social Supermarket!

Imagine pocket parks in the centre of Mansfield where you could relax, meet friends or where your children could let off steam.

New and improved green spaces, along with plants, seating and lighting, are among the ways we plan to improve the town centre.

In addition to the £12m from the Towns Fund, we have £1m of Government money to deliver a project aimed at making the town more visually appealing and environmentally friendly.

In Autumn 2020, we commissioned Via East Midlands and Edge to explore possible ideas, which resulted in them identifying existing pedestrian and vehicle routes, which would benefit from the urban greening project.

Designs are well underway and we hope that work on the first projects will start this autumn and be complete by next spring. They may include the following but nothing was set in stone at the time of printing.

Pocket park

We plan to develop a lovely green space in place of the existing car park behind the Old Town Hall, with grass and seating to create a tranquil area for people to enjoy while visiting the town. We want children to have fun and be able to let off steam in new and improved urban green spaces.

Statement lighting

We want to improve the look of the low bridges on Stockwell Gate by illuminating the underneath of them with different colours and designs. This will make the route more welcoming and feel safer for pedestrians.

Planting

Who doesn't smile when they see a pretty flower? We will be placing lowmaintenance plants and wildflowers around Quaker Way. They will attract bees and butterflies while also cleverly absorbing pollution and making Mansfield a cleaner, greener place to live, work and visit.

Improved public realm

This fancy phrase simply refers to any space that is free for anyone to access. We want to upgrade the entrance to the subway, which links the Four Seasons Shopping Centre to the former bus station site, which will soon be home to a hotel and leisure development.

Sadly, we currently have one of the lowest rates for educational attainment in the country and this has resulted in a lowskills low-pay local economy.

Together with all our key partners and providers of education and training, we want to raise young people's aspirations and inspire them to work in our district.

We want to connect young people with our local business community, particularly those in our key and growing sectors and retain local, highly skilled young people for the benefit of the public sector, our local businesses and the wider Mansfield economy.

One of our tools for developing, retaining and attracting talent is the Mansfield Skills Plan.

The plan has five main aims:

- Provide education connected to business needs by working with schools to broaden horizons, make links between learning and work, provide career insights and tackle gender stereotypes.
- Connect young people to jobs, encourage career progression and business start-ups, raising aspirations, self-belief and motivation levels.
- Expand the number of apprenticeships on offer by encouraging local businesses to invest in high quality, technical and degree level qualifications.
- Make better use of higher education, talent and resources by helping and making it easier for young people to access further and higher education locally.
- Tackle skills gaps, mismatches and shortages by providing and matching young people's skills with opportunities available.

Waste and Recycling

CREATING A CLEANER, GREENER, MANSELELD

In response to the global emergency of climate change, we have put this topic at the top of our priorities, embedding the theme into our corporate strategy and wider delivery plans that span the length and breadth of the organisation.

GLASS RECYCLING

One of the first major improvements is our new kerbside glass collections from homes.

The scheme, which started at the beginning of April, allows residents to recycle clean glass bottles and jars of any colour.

The majority of homes in the district have received a wheeled bin. Flats and



complexes have been provided with a communal bin and we will be putting additional bottle banks in suitable



locations to make it easy for as many households as possible to recycle.

In the first eight weeks of the scheme, we collected over 400 tonnes of recyclable glass. Recycling (blue) bins contaminated with glass has dropped from 11% to just 3.7%.

With your help we can improve the environment by increasing the amount we recycle and reducing the amount of glass that goes to landfill or for incineration.

In support of Keep Britain Tidy's Great British Spring Clean, we brought our Tidy Together campaign back to help make the district even cleaner and greener.

During the campaign we offered free bulky waste collections, which would usually cost up to £21.50, and discounted electrical goods collections for just £5 instead of £17.

We cleaned up and maintained parts of our town centre and supported friends groups and community groups with litter picks by providing equipment and collecting bagged waste.

Thank you to everyone who got involved and helped make Mansfield district a place where people are proud to live and work.

RECYCLING

To help protect the environment, we should try to reuse or recycle as much as possible.

Recycling waste allows it to be made into something else. Currently, 33.6% of waste in Mansfield is recycled. We are working hard to increase this figure.

> Since the start of the year, 48 lorry loads of recycling have been rejected at the sorting centre due to contamination. This results in all the items being taken to landfill, at great cost to the council.

The most common items that are incorrectly found in blue bins are:

- Non-recyclable plastics
- Tetra Paks
- Glass
- Non-recyclable paper or card (such as metallic)
- Textiles (such as clothing)

A new trial is taking place at the County's Recycling Centres. Tetra Pak and cartons are now accepted for recycling. Please note these can go to the Recycling Centres ONLY and should not go in your kerbside recycling bin.

The Government has announced plans to make recycling easier and more consistent across England. This includes proposals for weekly food waste collections from 2023.

We are supportive of plans that enable our residents to recycle as much as possible and reduce the impact on the environment.

First modular houses occupied

Tenants have moved in to the council's first pre-built modular housing development.



The six two-bedroom and four threebedroom energy efficient homes on Rosemary Avenue, in Mansfield, are part of a long-term programme to build around 300 affordable social housing homes in the district.

The homes were manufactured in a factory by Ilke Homes, delivered in large sections and pieced together on the site once the foundations. drainage and other services were in place.

The roof and cladding were added along with fenced boundaries, landscaped gardens, parking and footpaths.

Midlands construction company G F Tomlinson, which used local supply chain partners, carried out the building work.

The properties were allocated to tenants through the council's housing site Homefinder.



A planning application has been submitted for the development of 77 homes on Centenary Road, Mansfield. Subject to

housing

approval, it is hoped that building work could start early next year.

The scheme would provide 48 homes for older people, including 16 bungalows which are in short supply, plus 29 general needs houses and apartments. The mix of affordable housing is designed to suit the needs of the local community and all the properties will be owned and managed by the council.

The layout of the development aims to prevent car rat-runs and create a pleasant low-traffic environment.

Cut your bills and carbon emissions

Grants are available to owner-occupiers in specific areas who have a household income of less than £30.000 and whose home has a low Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating.

As well as improving the appearance of the property, external wall insulation will help reduce heating bills and cut carbon emissions.

For a limited time only, private landlords will also qualify for a grant. However, they will need to contribute 33% towards the cost of the works.

Energy efficient homes on the way

Work is due to start imminently on a pilot project of ultra-low energy council homes for affordable rent.


The four homes on the site of the former tenants meeting room on Saundby Avenue off Westfield Lane, are being built to a Passivhaus design. This reduces their ecological footprint and results in them needing little energy for heating or cooling.

The project is one of the first to benefit from the council's new procurement strategy, which puts a greater emphasis on social, environmental and economic factors.

As part of the contract with local developers Robert Woodhead Ltd. the project will create local training and employment opportunities, support Small and Medium Enterprises, involve school children and community organisations and reduce carbon emissions through the planting of trees and by recycling a high percentage of construction waste.

Cycle track is wheely good news!

Teaching children to ride a bicycle in Mansfield is set to become easier, thanks to a grant from British Cycling to create a new learn-to-ride track.



The grant from British Cycling's Places to Ride programme will go towards the £19,000 learn-to-ride track next to a proposed new children's play area off Egmanton Road in the Bellamy Road estate.

The cycling project will form part of a proposed £5.7m redevelopment of the centre of the estate which will involve demolishing a row of flats and shops in Egmanton Road and replacing them with 22 family homes built around a "village green" with a new play area and community orchard.

If all goes 'wheely' well, the track will be open by April 2022 and plans are underway for South Mansfield Community Centre to run a bike loan scheme for families who wish to give it a go.

The facility will allow children aged two to eight to learn to cycle in a safe, traffic-free environment and aligns with the council's priorities on Place, Wellbeing and Aspiration.
