# Millions of pounds on the way for regeneration

Exciting plans to turn Berry Hill Park into the district's first 'destination park' were recently unveiled.









A destination park goes above and beyond what an average park would offer and ideas for this ambitious scheme include accessible footpaths, a dedicated outdoor event space, a new building with a multi-functional space, café, toilets and changing rooms.

The plans take on board feedback from nearly 1,000 people who responded to a consultation held last year. Artist impressions of the plans can be viewed online at www.mansfield.gov.uk/ berryhillparkgallery.

The project is one of six that will benefit from a total of  $\pounds 12.3m$  from the Towns Fund.



### Details of the other projects will be announced soon, after the business cases have been finalised.

They are:

- The creation of business incubation units at Mansfield Woodhouse Station Gateway.
- An infrastructure network across the town, which could provide electronic signs to direct motorists to places of interest and parking spaces in real time.
- The creation of a new brand for the district supported by an annual programme of public events.
- A future technology skills and knowledge exchange centre at Vision West Nottinghamshire College's Chesterfield Road site.
- Warsop Health Hub at Carr Lane Park: comprising a 15m x 8m swimming pool, a multi-use games area (MUGA), changing village, fitness suite, community and office space, multi-purpose dividable hall, café, viewing and reception area.

#### Take part in climate change survey

We're keen to learn more about how people feel about climate change.

There's still time to take part in our public consultation on the council's draft Climate Change Strategy which runs until 4 April.

The council's ambition is to make Mansfield carbon neutral by 2040, after formally declaring a climate emergency in 2019.

It is currently reviewing all of its operations and services to establish what actions need be taken to reduce its carbon emissions and how we can all adapt and become more resilient to the effects of climate change.

The former Beales department store is set to be transformed into a new multi-agency civic hub as part of our ambitious, long-term town centre regeneration plans.

Known as Mansfield Connect, it will be the new headquarters for the council with the current Civic Centre site being made available for redevelopment.

The hub is expected to house a variety of other public, educational, enterprise and health and wellbeing services, plus private sector occupiers such as food and drink outlets.

The scheme, which aims to encourage a range of people to visit the town centre, will form a central part of our bid to the Government's Levelling Up Fund.

It sits alongside other major regeneration projects including the council's emerging Town Centre Masterplan and Urban Greening project, as well as Severn Trent's Green Recovery Flood Resilience Project and ARBA's hotel and leisure development on Stockwell Gate North.

# Look up for heritage

A message encouraging visitors to 'look up!' will appear on pavements in Mansfield town centre.

The temporary stencils aim to direct attention to properties in the Leeming Street and Market Place conservation area that will benefit from the Townscape Heritage Project. The £1.3m five-year initiative has benefited from £849,100 from the National Lottery Heritage Fund, raised by National Lottery players.

As work progresses with local businesses and property owners ahead of work to enhance the appearance of the Victorian and Georgian architecture, the project team is looking for history detectives to uncover stories related to the buildings.

You can discuss all aspects of townscape heritage with the project team from 10am to 3pm on the last Wednesday of every month at Mansfield Museum. The next dates are 30 March, 27 April and 25 May.

Townscape Tales, an exhibition revealing stories of historic town centre buildings, is coming to Mansfield Museum from Monday 1 August. See 'then and now' photographs showing how buildings have changed and find out more thanks to interviews with people who were there.

#### Here comes the... new tenant

The keys to the third and final retail unit inside the refurbished Old Town Hall have been handed over to its new tenant.

She believes the Town Hall is a stunning location that will provide a perfect experience for any brideto-be and budding seamstresses.

Oh Sew Suzy joins Robins Return, an independent family-run business, selling personalised, unique and unusual gifts and interiors products, and R&R Permanent Make-up Studio and Beauty Training.

The council's Town Centre Management team and Halo Recruitment are also based inside the building, while Victoria Hallam Hair Boutique and Henry George Menswear have exterior units.

The council contributed £775,000 towards the £1.4m scheme, with £700,000 delivered by the D2N2 Local Enterprise Partnership as part of its £7.63m N2 Town Centres Programme.

# Greening u Mansfield

#### A sandstone sculpture will be the focal point of a new memorial garden behind the Old Town Hall.

The 2.4 metre sculpture will be in keeping with the grade II\* listed town hall. It will celebrate Mansfield and its community, fortitude and resilience as the district looks to the future. Inspirational words will be engraved around the base of the sculpture and within the seating walls of the garden.

Terraced grassed areas will cascade down the former car park from Queen Street towards the town hall. The calm, reflective space will feature trees, plants and uplighting.

Both new pocket parks, with Edge and VIA East Midlands as lead designers, are part of the

£1m of Towns Fund accelerated funding

The green space has been designed to improve air quality and water drainage.

Another key part of the Urban Greening project, is the creation of a pocket park with slide for youngsters on the corner of Walkden Street and Quaker Way.

Smaller projects will see improved lighting of the road bridge on Stockwell Gate, planting on Quaker Way in front of the entrance ramp to the Four Seasons car park and planters, street furniture and lighting on the concourse area of the old bus station.

All these projects have been paid for by  $\pounds 1m$  of Towns Fund accelerated funding.

All these improvements will help make Mansfield more attractive and encourage people to spend more time, and therefore money, in the town centre.

# **Greener homes bid**

Work is set to start on an insulation scheme for 12 council flats at Farnsfield Court and Shireoaks Court on the Bellamy estate which should see tenants lower their annual fuel bills by £300 to £500.

Mansfield is one of 19 areas of the country to benefit from a government decarbonisation pilot project to help lower energy consumption in social housing and thereby reduce carbon emissions and fuel bills. The work will cost £720,000 with £360,000 coming from the government and the same amount funded by the council.

We are hoping to offer more low income home owners improved insulation to help cut their fuel bills.

So far, the government's Green Homes Grant scheme has improved the insulation in 80 owner occupier properties throughout the district.

If our new bid is successful, we will be able to improve another 70 privately owned properties in Mansfield Woodhouse and Forest Town.

# Cycle track work on course

Construction has begun to create a new Learn to Cycle track and play area on the Bellamy Road estate in Mansfield. It is hoped they will be ready to use by the summer.

The recreational facilities are the first part of a major £7m scheme to redevelop the heart of the estate with new high quality, energy efficient council homes to be let at an affordable rent.

As well as 22 two, three and four-bedroom family homes, the redevelopment includes a new single storey parade of retail outlets and a traffic-calmed road connecting Thorpe Road and Egmanton Road to allow for improved bus connections.

# **£2m of leisure** improvements

## Exciting improvements and changes are on the way to our leisure centres.

Serco's new 10-year contract for the management of three leisure centres will result in £2m of improvements and investment of £333,000 in carbon reducing and energy saving measures.

At Water Meadows, customers can expect to see new water features, refurbished gym and pool changing rooms, a new climbing wall and party room. Oak Tree Leisure Centre will get an outdoor 3G sports pitch, a group cycling studio, a Shapemaster toning suite, a community hub and an inflatable Wipe Out-style obstacle course. A 'Poolview' system will be installed at



Rebecca Adlington Swimming Centre to enhance pool supervision and create a safer swimming environment.

River Maun Recreation Centre is to become a community hub in April when Nottingham-based Switch Up takes over the day-to-day operation.

As well as a boxing gym in the main sports hall, Switch Up will provide activities such as mentoring, education, counselling and physical activity all aimed at reducing antisocial behaviour in young people.

# **New FOOD club opens**

## We have supported the opening of the district's sixth FOOD (Food On Our Doorstep) Club.

It operates from the APTCOO building behind the GP surgery in Sandy Lane every Tuesday from 10am to 12noon.

Like the other FOOD clubs in the district, it costs £1 a year to join. You must live or work within 15 minutes of the club. You'll be able to buy a bag of food worth up to £15 for just £3.50 every week.

We also help to run FOOD clubs in the Bellamy Road, Dallas Street, Oak Tree, Ravensdale and Clipstone areas.

# **Plenty of space**

Did you know that all the parking bays in Walkden Street car park are extra wide?

The multi-storey car park, off Rosemary Street, has reopened following refurbishment.

All 307 spaces are the same size as parent/ toddler bays and those for blue badge holders. This makes it ideal for those who need extra space – such as those who use mobility aids, drive larger vehicles, or who travel with babies and young children in car seats.

Parking costs £1 an hour, with three hours for the price of two hours, and you can pay by card or cash.

The car park benefits from improved natural lighting and ventilation as a result of new geometric cladding that replaced the concrete panels that had reached the end of their natural life.

# Your Council Tax for 2022/2

With spring comes the new financial year and the need to balance the council's budget.

Our district councillors are acutely aware of how difficult it is going to be for many residents and businesses to cope with the increased cost of living, so have taken various steps to help out.

This includes freezing the district portion of Council Tax. As the vast majority of our residents live in Band A properties, it means most people will continue to pay a total of £129.81 for the year from April 2022 for all the services provided by Mansfield District Council. That's around 35p a day.

It's worth remembering that only 10p in every £1 you pay comes to the district council; 90p goes to the county council and other organisations such as Police and Fire.

Councillors have also added extra funding to strengthen our Council Tax Hardship Support Scheme for our vulnerable residents and the economic stimulus fund to support businesses. They also made a 10% cut in the councillors' special responsibility allowance.

# Safer streets for Mansfield

By the end of March, eight new CCTV cameras are expected to have been installed in and around Mansfield and 186 households will have had free home security improvements carried out in a project to make the district safer.

The £482,000 Safer Streets scheme, launched last year, and funded by the Home Office has involved Mansfield District Council leading the project working with partners including the police, Mansfield CVS and the county council highways services, Via, to cut crime in the district.

New CCTV cameras are being assigned to Welbeck Street, Newcastle Street, Wood Street, Rosemary Street, Chesterfield Road South, Queen Street, Dame Flogan Street and Midworth Street.

Residents have also been offered free vehicle security upgrades, improved street lighting, extra high-visibility police patrols...

Free home security measures, such as five lever door locks, window alarms, sensor lighting, toughened windows and doors, secure side gates and CCTV, have been installed at homes in the areas most at risk from burglary.

# Creating sustainable flood resilient communities in Mansfield



On an average rainy day in Mansfield, we get around 2,000,000 litres of water falling on every square kilometre.

In the past, we had plenty of green areas to soak up rain water. However, we've lost many of these spaces due to development and urban creep and the town is now less 'sponge-like'.

There's a real risk of our drains being unable to cope with heavy rainfall, leading to flooding.

So, say hello to SuDS (Sustainable Drainage Systems).

SuDS cover a range of things, like rain gardens, planters, even water-absorbent permeable paving. They mimic natural drainage processes, dealing with rainfall close to where it falls. And we're investing £76 million to bring 15,000 SuDS to Mansfield!

Rain gardens are a great example of SuDS in practice. Using plants and soil to retain and slow the flow of rainwater from surrounding hard surfaces, they naturally filter pollutants like oil and silt carried by urban runoff. The water is stored beneath the soil before being sent back to the sewer - cleaner and at a slower rate - or being soaked into the surrounding ground to replenish groundwater.

Permeable paving is also another great way to reduce flood risks with added benefits. They not only slow down and store rainwater, but means still keeping much needed parking for residents.

When complete in 2025, Mansfield SuDS will be able to store over 58 million litres of surface water – that's about 23 Olympic-sized swimming pools. And means reduced flood risk for 90,000 people! So look out for a greener, cleaner Mansfield. stwater.co.uk/Mansfield
