

Foreword

Welcome to this latest edition of MyMansfield and what a busy year it has been!

When I first became Mayor in 2019, I knew there was a big job ahead. I wanted to see Mansfield prosper and I wanted life to be improved for all our citizens.

Delivering changes of this nature and magnitude was never going to be a quick fix. We are not there yet but we are getting closer to where we would like to be in terms of actioning the council's four priorities: Growth, Aspiration, Wellbeing and Place.

A new technology and skills centre for West Notts College is progressing to help raise aspirations and address serious and long standing skills shortages in this district which are hampering its growth potential.

Likewise, work has now begun in Warsop on a new health hub, with swimming pool and gym, among other facilities, which will help to improve the health and wellbeing, and quality of life for people in this part of the district. We can't wait to see it in use next year.

Then there are the new energy efficient and affordable council homes we are building.

We've already delivered on some of this programme, and we've now started to build 22 family homes on the Bellamy estate.

More homes will be built in the coming years in a major development to regenerate the White Hart Street area of the town centre.

An international competition to find an outstanding design for this important scheme was a huge success, resulting in an exciting concept for this project.

Another major town centre project will be repurposing the old Beales building. Both projects are strands in a wider strategy to bring the town centre back to life by having people living and working in the beating heart of the district.

I feel privileged to have another four years in office as Executive Mayor to see these big projects come to fruition.

It's a job I'd love to continue after 2027, too, but that will depend on the citizens of Mansfield, because, as promised, I will be asking you if this style of governance should continue or if I should be the final Executive Mayor of Mansfield.

We can offer help for domestic abuse

The council has become a beacon of good practice in its response to survivors of domestic abuse. It has achieved the Domestic Abuse Housing Alliance (DAHA) Accreditation (Foundational), a UK benchmark in supporting survivors of domestic abuse, after training its entire workforce to be more aware of the signs of domestic abuse and how to support survivors. Awareness stickers have been placed on all front-line service vehicles. Survivors of domestic abuse can now look out for ribbons and badges worn by council staff if they wish to access support. The council will listen to what they need and discuss choices to enable them to make informed decisions.

Shops and cafés open in our town centre

We have seen an increase in the number of new shops opening within the town centre in the last few months. Some notable ones include the town's first Starbucks opening at Four Seasons Shopping Centre where local success story, Toffee Hut, has also opened a second outlet. Did you know that all businesses within our district have to pay business rates? These rates are a tax, not a service charge, by Mansfield District Council. It is a central Government requirement to collect them.

Political changes at council after election

On 4 May 2023, Andy Abrahams was re-elected as Mansfield's Executive Mayor. Andy, who grew up on Ladybrook estate, has set out his vision for the next four years of his term. His pledges include caring and protecting our communities, regenerating our town and district and investing in skills and the local economy.

The 2023 local elections have also seen a new cohort of councillors join Mansfield District Council. The authority now has a Labour ruling majority, changing from no overall control previously.

An event fit for a King!

Residents across the district came together to celebrate His Majesty King Charles III being officially crowned at Westminster Abbey. The momentous occasion was celebrated at Berry Hill Park with an afternoon of brass bands, picnics. knitting and family entertainment.



Warsop Health Hub progress update

Construction has started on the new health hub at Carr Lane Park in Warsop which is set to expand significantly the parish's leisure, wellbeing and community provisions. Due to open in summer 2024. the new hub will see the installation of a new 15m x 8m swimming pool, a splash play area, changing village, a gym, a multi-purpose hall, a café and IT area, and community space. A stone's throw away from the main site will also see the creation of a new and improved multi-use games area, due to open in early 2024.

Progress on Beales

The £20m project that will see the former Beales building transformed into a multi-agency hub is making significant progress behind the scenes. The Design Services team is working closely with partners on the design and space requirements needed for all organisations who have signed up to be part of the project. Currently signed up are the Department for Work and Pensions. Mansfield CVS. Vision West Nottinghamshire College, Nottinghamshire County Council and Mansfield District Council.



White Hart Street design's a winner!



Plans for a flagship housing scheme on a derelict site close to Mansfield town centre have been revealed.

Proctor and Matthews Architects are taking the scheme forward after winning an international competition to find an outstanding design for the development.

Full Council is expected to consider the business case for the plan in early 2024. If approved, a planning application will be submitted and if that is approved, demolition work could start around October 2024 and building work in February 2025.

The brownfield land, which has stood derelict for over a decade, is located within the Bridge Street Conservation Areas and contains buildings of historic and architectural merit. The proposed development aims to retain and improve the existing heritage properties.

The Full Council approved a £16.5m budget in 2019 to build new council homes on the site and the council purchased land in this area in 2022 in order to facilitate its regeneration. It will be exploring opportunities to work with other partners to increase this budget through grant funding.

The properties are expected to be a mix of housing types, including family houses and apartments for older people, and built to the energy efficient Future Homes Standard, in line with the council's Climate Emergency Action Plan.

Work starts on council homes

An extensive redevelopment programme in the heart of a Mansfield estate is moving to the next phase with works now starting on-site.

Mercer Building Solutions are undertaking numerous works in the Bellamy Road estate on behalf of the council following a competitive tender process.

The £7m upgrade has been conducted in phases and has already seen the opening of a new play park and learn-to-ride cycle track in 2022.

The next stage, which is now underway, will see 22 high-quality, ecofriendly, affordable family council homes built around the newly installed village green area.

Following that, demolition works will begin on the site of the existing shops and five flats in Egmanton Road, and also the building of a new single-storey parade of retail outlets with a convenience store, cafe and takeaway.

There will also be a community orchard planted and a new trafficcalmed through road connecting Thorpe Road and Egmanton Road. which will allow for improved bus connections through this part of the estate.

The council's in-house architects have designed the new homes to align with government carbon reduction targets and the Future Homes Standard, which is expected to be adopted nationally by 2025. The houses, comprising three four-bedroom semi-detached houses, eight three-bedroom semi-detached houses, nine two-bedroom semidetached houses and two two-bedroom detached houses, will be offered at affordable rents and will be owned and managed by Mansfield District Council.

Tech and Skills hub moves to next phase

A multi-million pound technology and skills centre is set to be built in Mansfield after the go-ahead by councillors.

The ambitious scheme will see a new teaching and innovation space created at the Chesterfield Road campus of West Nottinghamshire College.

The Future Tech Skills and Knowledge Exchange aims to address high-value employment opportunities in priority sectors and support businesses to adopt new technologies.

> The £8.8m campus is due to open in autumn 2024

This state-of-the-art education facility, due to open in autumn 2024, will deliver qualifications at level 3 and above, with a strong focus on innovation and STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) subjects.

The project was approved after a site visit by the council's planning applications committee to address concerns about the scheme being located with a conservation area. The campus will offer local

people the opportunity to meet future labour market needs, plug skills gaps, and, ultimately, help to create wellpaid jobs in Mansfield and the wider district.


Student website is the perfect place to Start

System speeds up waste service and cuts paper and fuel

A new digital system has revolutionised Mansfield District Council's waste and recycling service, saving time, paper and fuel.

The in-cab technology introduced this year automatically assigns jobs in a way that makes any extra journeys cost-effective on fuel and time.

The Whitespace system also means the council can allocate jobs to its crews without having manually assess them and then print them out on round sheets, saving paper and printing costs.



The new system can tell crews on their rounds which properties have assisted collections and which homes have subscribed to the council's garden waste service.

Whitespace has also been rolled out to other front-line services, including parks and street cleansing to create maximum efficiency in their day-to-day tasks.



Pilot scheme using local suppliers is a success



The scheme initially began in two clubs, and will now continue for another eight weeks at St John's in Mansfield.

The delivery of the pilot has been made possible thanks to funding and expertise from Feeding Britain, a charity that advocates for systemic change to eliminate hunger in the UK.

Mansfield-based business Troops supplies the food clubs with the same quantity of carrots, potatoes, and onions weekly. The scheme has also seen the addition of eggs and milk in the weekly boxes for residents to purchase.

Report noise nuisance on app

Mansfield District Council is reminding residents that there is a simple mobile phone app they can download if they are suffering from persistent noise nuisance problems.





"The Noise App 2" is available from Google Play Store and Apple App store and can record and capture noise issues. These can then be submitted via the app for the council to investigate. The app has just been upgraded to Version 2.0 which now allows users to submit videos.

In 2022, the council received 315 noise complaints. Two legal notices were served and complied with. This year, there have been 221 complaints so far. Legal notices have been served in three cases. In one, the council is working with the landlord of a property to evict a tenant. In another, a pub has changed the way it operates. Further legal proceedings are expected in the third case. For Oak Tree, this news marks an incredible achievement: the fifth time in a row that it has been shortlisted for this award.



New play area to enjoy

A play area in the district has been transformed for children of all abilities to enjoy.

Ladybrook Park has seen the installation of new equipment, benches and flooring thanks to Section 106 contributions the council has received from housing developments in the district.

The new apparatus ensures that everyone has an outdoor space to burn off energy, have fun and enjoy the great outdoors.



Works to enhance park move to next stage

Ambitious plans to create a cafe, two new play areas and improve the paths at Berry Hill Park have taken a significant leap forward.

The planning application for the project has been submitted and is due to be considered by the council's planning applications committee on 20 November.

Expressions of interest are being sent out to contractors ahead of a full procurement process. The area sits within 25 hectares of parkland with a diverse mix of woodlands, mown grassland, acid grassland and wildflower meadows.

The plans include a new building with a multi-functional space, café and toilets.



Prestigious Green Flags have been awarded to seven of Mansfield parks and nature reserves for the eighth year in a row.

The green spaces that have achieved the standard in the district are: Carr Bank Park, Titchfield Park and King George V Park, all in Mansfield, plus Peafield Park and Yeoman Hill Park, in Mansfield Woodhouse, and two Local Nature Reserves at Quarry Lane, Mansfield, and The Carrs, in Warsop.

Garden opens in town centre

The Memorial Garden in the town centre is officially open.

The new green space behind the Old Town Hall is a key part of making the town centre greener and an important element of the Town Centre Masterplan. The centrepiece of the new open space is a 2.4m high obelisk, weighing 1,400kg, and carved from Derbyshire gritstone. At the obelisk's base is a circle of Cumbrian green slate with carved words to support the concept of remembrance.

Seating, trees, plants, terraced grass areas and feature lighting surround the sculpture.

CCTV cameras have also been installed on Queen Street to ensure the garden is used appropriately and to reduce the risk of anti-social behaviour.

The garden has been designed to improve the air quality, water drainage and physical appearance of the town centre.







Anyone for tennis at revamped courts?

Tennis courts at Racecourse Park and Carr Bank Park have officially reopened following extensive refurbishments.

The revamp has seen the installation of top-quality surfacing, new markings, new nets on all eight courts, perimeter fencing repairs and replacement.

A small fee of £5 per hour will be charged to ensure the courts are maintained at the new high standard for years to come.

Work starts on new one-bed council flats

On site works have begun to build four one-bed council apartments in Oak Tree.

The site for the new flats at Fritchley Court was previously home to an old district heating system boiler house. That has been demolished to make way for the new homes. The authority approved the budget to redevelop the site in 2022 and it is expected to cost about £800,000 to complete.

On-site parking for six cars will be provided, alongside small gardens and a communal grass area for residents.

The new homes will also be futureproofed with low carbon emissions heating and high energy efficiency, building on the council's commitment to the green agenda and reaching net zero by 2040.

New priorities for community safety

A new community safety strategy for Mansfield has pledged to make tackling antisocial behaviour, neighbourhood crimes and protecting vulnerable people priorities in the coming years. Museum awarded £76,700 for new exhibit

Mansfield Museum has been awarded money from Arts Council England to display its internationally significant collection of butterflies, moths, and rare birds.

The re-interpretation of The Joseph Whitaker Bird Collection will promote a deeper understanding of the natural world by improving the storage, display, and interpretation in an exhibition.

The collection hosts 3,000 bird species in various shapes and sizes from around the world, some of them rare or on the brink of extinction.

New water feature and pond at crematorium

A new pond and water feature have been installed at Mansfield Crematorium for visitors to sit, enjoy and reflect. The newly revamped green space has been purpose-built to enhance the original rockery already on the site and create a reflective and peaceful space for the public



attending services, or for visitors to sit and pause to remember a loved one. A variety of green plants have also been installed around the area to encourage wildlife, and further enhance the new space.

Bike thefts and arson attacks decrease on estate

Bike thefts and arson attacks in a part of Mansfield have seen a significant decrease since the neighbourhood has been the focus of a crime cutting campaign.

New figures are showing the effectiveness of the Safer4All campaign on the Oak Tree estate where bicycle thefts and arsons between October 2022 and March 2023 both saw a 96 percent reduction compared with April 2022 to September 2022. Motorbike thefts saw an 80 percent reduction over the same period.

The campaign aimed to reduce the number of bicycle and motorbike thefts and deliberately set fires, which were specific areas of concern on the estate.

It focused on distributing crime prevention measures, such as good quality bicycle locks, antitheft kits for motorbikes, and a schools education programme.

tips

Christmas cards, wrapping paper and envelops

As long as these items don't have foil, glitter, or a shiny coating, they can be placed in your recycling bin. If in doubt, use the

scrunch test on wrapping paper: if you scrunch the paper in your hand and it stays in a ball, it can go in the recycling bin.

Remove all ribbons, bows and sticky tape.

Waste food

Compost as much as you can, including vegetable and fruit peelings, teabags, eggshells, toilet roll tubes and cereal boxes. Cooked food. meat or fish should all go in your green general waste bin.



Christmas trees

Both real and artificial trees should be taken to your nearest recycling centre.

Plastic and foil food travs

Plastic and foil food trays go in your green general rubbish bin - they cannot be recycled.

Extra waste

We will be taking an additional bag of side waste for green collections the first week after Christmas. We will also take side waste during blue bin week. Fold any boxes down to save space!

Fairy lights and decorations

Glass and plastic baubles are not recyclable and go in your green bin.

Fairy lights can be recycled at your recycling centre.




