Council changes for the future

Over the next four years, Mansfield District Council is reviewing its services in a programme called Change for the Future to close a funding gap of £4.5m – 36% of its budget. Although there are no plans to do this, this is the equivalent of a 75% increase in Council Tax.

ike many authorities across the country, Mansfield
District Council is faced with the financial challenge of presenting a balanced budget for the years ahead.

Government grants are set to fall by 80% from £10m in 2010 to just £2m in 2020 so the council is having to put in place changes that make it more self-sufficient to help plug this gap in funding.

Chief Executive of the council Bev Smith said: "Quite simply we are undergoing a process of change to become fit for the future. We need to address financial challenges and ensure our services are customer focused."

As well as delivering the council's key priorities and maintaining an excellent level of service, one of the main targets of the Change for the Future programme is to save £4.5m by 2020.

It will include an evaluation of the council's assets and a root and branch

review of services to see if they can be done more efficiently, by, for instance, making better use of information technology and to find ways for the council to generate additional commercial income from its services.

Part of Change for the Future will be completed in a matter of months; others will take up to a year to complete. Further reviews will be carried out over the following years covering all services provided by the council. Staff at all levels are involved in the reviews and their ideas will help to inform the proposals.

For residents, it may mean they see a change in the way services are delivered, but equally the changes being made, may go on behind the scenes and make no obvious difference.

If reforms to services are proposed as a result of the review, there will be further public consultation about these changes before they are implemented.

Hundreds of people defied the rain to mark the Queen's 90th birthday at a street party in Mansfield Market Place.

rapped in rain macs and with umbrellas in hand, the crowds, enjoyed live music by Derbyshire band Dammit Jack, children's pony rides, party entertainment and face painting, as well as craft market and giant garden games at the event on Sunday 12 June.

The free event saw lots of giveaways including Union Jack flags, stickers and Mansfield Market shopping bags as well as Victoria sponge tasters.

The Mansfield Business Improvement District (Mansfield BID), who worked in partnership with the council, also laid on a 'Design a bag' competition for children to commemorate the Queen's 90th Birthday.

To mark the event, groups of volunteers helped decorate the town centre via the street art phenomenon known as 'yarn

bombing', covering trees, railings and lamp posts in patriotic knitted and crocheted pieces.

The display has since been taken down and the items washed, ready to be stitched together and made into blankets for local charities helping the homeless.

Yarn bomb co-ordinator, Sara Brown of Yankee Yarns wool shop in Mansfield, said: "We're very proud of all the volunteers who contributed to this campaign. The town looked so bright and cheerful."

The annual summer exhibition is one of the highlights of the museum calendar. Recent years have seen extravaganzas based around the London Olympics, the woodlands of Britain, (complete with a tree-bark forest floor), and miniature worlds featuring live mice.

Museum grows Tim's space seeds

School children in Mansfield are waiting to hear the results of their experiment with seeds from the International Space Station as part of the Royal Horticultural Society's Campaign for School Gardening.

The project has been developed by the UK Space Agency to celebrate astronaut Tim Peake's mission to the space station.

One hundred seeds, which had been in space since September 2015, were returned to Earth in March and grown by children across the country, including Mansfield Museum, to provide information to help to better understand the difficulties of growing fresh fruit and vegetables to support human life on other planets in the future.

Plea over dog fouling

Mansfield District Council is appealing for your help to deal with serial dog fouling offenders in the district.



After a successful campaign in April to crack down on dog fouling in Mansfield, the council is asking for the public's help to collar serial dog fouling offenders.

The campaign coincided with the introduction of compulsory dog microchipping in April, which has led to more than 500 dogs being "chipped" by the council.

It also came in advance of new powers to come into force the district next month, which will mean dog walkers could be fined if they fail to carry the means to pick up their dog's faeces.

More than 150 "poop scoop bag dispensers" were handed out to owners in April six £75 fixed penalty notices.

People who complain to the council about dog fouling are now being asked for more information, all reports will now be logged centrally to allow the council to respond more effectively to complaints from the public.

Schools, community groups and residents joined forces to take part in a Week of Action in Mansfield Woodhouse run by Mansfield District Council last month.

he week of action, aimed to improve the local environment in Mansfield Woodhouse and included a community litter pick.

Councillors and council neighbourhood wardens were joined by residents for the event and more than a dozen bags of rubbish were collected. Peafield were also involved and planted up sensory flower beds in Peafield Park.

The campaign sprang into action with a neighbourhood warden surgery, when residents were able to flag up concerns about the area with local wardens.

They were also able to learn about TV licensing and the laws and rules about watching downloads, live TV online and on-demand.

This was followed by a week of events, including litter pick, dog fouling patrols and fly-tipping enforcement. Advice and quidance was given on environmental issues and there was targeted enforcement of unkempt areas.

The course will enable you to:

- Increase vour confidence in the kitchen
- Enjoy a wide range of new recipes
- Receive friendly step by step quidance
- Learn how to cook on a budget

Healthy Lifestyle Officer Sandra Alvey says: "We can design a package to suit the needs of any group, regardless of age or circumstances. All our programmes are very hands on and offer good, practical advice that will enable

people to think more about what are they are eating and will encourage them to reach for a healthy recipe rather than a ready meal.

"We work with local community groups, such as the Nifty Fifty exercise group for people over 50, covering topics such as cooking for diabetics, reducing salt in your diet and following a Mediterranean diet.

"We also work with the Strengthening Families programme, which supports parents who are experiencing difficulties with their children. In these sessions we encourage mums, dads and children to cook together."

The pride of sporting achievement in Mansfield, Ollie Hynd and Charlotte Henshaw, are on the road to Rio to represent Great Britain in the Paralympics.

opes are high that Mansfield's Paralympian swimmers Ollie Hynd MBE and Charlotte Henshaw will be bringing back gold medals from Rio de Janeiro after being chosen to represent Great Britain in in this year's Paralympic Games in Brazil.

The two swimmers, who are coached by Mansfield District Council's Swim Coach and Development Officer Glenn Smith, were chosen for Team GB in May after achieving stunning results in the IPC Swimming European Championships held in Madeira in May and posting qualification times at the Paralympic trials in Glasgow in April.

They will now be training hard for the Rio Paralympics, which start on 7 September 2016, and are considered to be in with a good chance of bringing home medals for the British team.

Ollie Hynd is currently one of the most celebrated and highly ranked male para-swimmers in the world, being Paralympic, World, European and Commonwealth Champion and possessing several world record times. He said: "I am so proud to be selected for Rio for ParalympicsGB, it is such an honour. Rio will be an amazing experience."

Charlotte Henshaw added: "I always feel proud to compete for my country but competing for ParalympicsGB is something even more special. I can't wait to make everyone proud."

Their award-winning coach Glenn Smith said: "They are amazing people and athletes and I am an immensely proud coach.

"In a sport that requires a brutal training regime day in and day out, it is testament to their massive dedication and commitment that they have made the team.

"The focus now is on the games in September and they know it will require another step up in performance.

"But rest assured they will be doing everything possible to make Great Britain, Mansfield District Council, the surrounding community, Nottinghamshire, Nova Centurion Swimming Club and Nottinghamshire Amateur Swimming Association proud."

Summer is here and gardens are in full bloom, so now is a good time to sign up for the council's brown bin garden waste service.

Garden waste cannot be placed in green household waste bins, as when the waste is buried at landfill sites, it produces large amounts of methane. a powerful greenhouse gas that contributes to global warming.

The brown bin collection service offers a convenient way for people to dispose of garden rubbish, which then goes for recycling to be made into compost and used in agriculture.



For £30 a year, your brown bin is emptied fortnightly from March to November and once a month in December, January and February.

If you do not wish to subscribe to the scheme, you can compost your garden waste at home, or take it to your local recycling centre.

Grants available for independent living

Disabled Facilities Grants (DFGs) help to pay for essential adaptations to make it easier for disabled residents to live in their homes independently.

Over the past 12 months, 48 private homeowners across the Mansfield district have had their home adapted, thanks to a grant from Mansfield District Council.

DFGs can be used to provide adaptations such as stair-lifts, ceiling track hoists, through floor lifts, accessible shower facilities and wash and dry toilets.



To be eligible for a grant you must:

- be disabled
- either own your own home or rent from a private landlord or housing association
- have difficulty managing daily living tasks
- be assessed by an occupational therapist as having a need

If you live in a council-owned or housing association property, you may still be able to get adaptations to your home subject to an occupational therapy assessment, but they may be funded differently.

The Occupational Therapy service will assess your needs and may recommend what equipment and/or adaptations are needed to help you to live more independently. A DFG may not always be required following an

assessment and there may be other ways of meeting your needs e.g. through the provision of equipment such as handrails.

If a DFG is needed, the OT service will inform Mansfield District Council what work is necessary and appropriate to meet your needs. The district council's Strategic Housing service will then consider the application.

A financial assessment will also be carried out to see what, if any, contribution should be made by you.

If you think you would benefit from a DFG, you should contact Nottinghamshire County Council's Occupational Therapy (OT) service on 0300 500 8080.

My new Poppy Fie home is like a dream come true

A new complex of bungalows and apartments has been built by Mansfield District Council to provide extra care for older people in the town.

he Poppy Fields development. with its 64 new homes, has been carefully designed with safe, secure accommodation to give older people the opportunity to live as independently as possible.

It includes 48 homes for residents who have been assessed by Nottinghamshire County don't have to worry about Council. Ten homes are designed to support people with dementia.

Among the residents is Shirley Annable, 80, who has dementia.

She said: "I feel very happy here I couldn't have gone anywhere better. It's like a dream come true."

Her son, Alan Hinder, who travelled from Devon to join his mother at a Queen's 90th birthday party at the centre's communal hub last month, added: "This housing scheme is just fantastic - it means we don't have to worry about mum anymore because we know she is being well looked after. And mum loves it."

The ten bungalows are built around a shared courtyard, which has been designed to help create a calming atmosphere.

The complex includes a communal centre for people and a special reminiscence room.

> Meanwhile, the housing is designed with level access showers and wheelchair friendly layouts.

> All of the new homes have pull alarms in each room along with specific alarms and sensors which

could include alarms to detect trips or falls or wandering out of their homes at night.

Work to build 54 homes on the former General Hospital site is due to start next month.

Newly appointed contractors Wates Construction Ltd will build the £8.4 million Mansfield Senior Persons Living Scheme.

The gated development will provide 42 one-bed and two-bed apartments and 12 bungalows set around a 'village green' incorporating outdoor fitness equipment. The apartment block will also have a communal lounge and dining room and an outdoor.

The scheme, for people aged 55 plus, offers accommodation for residents with a range of needs. Six of the bungalows will be offered for Shared Ownership and the remaining bungalows and apartments will be for rent.

Ten apartments are for people with extra care needs and will be allocated by Nottinghamshire County Council, which is contributing £400,000 towards the scheme.

Safety hub is coming together

Work has begun at **Mansfield Civic Centre to** create a new Community Safety Partnership Hub.

The work, to create a combined area for the Mansfield District Council's community safety team and the Police, started at the end of June and is expected to take six weeks. It is expected that the hub will become operational in September.

At the moment the hub will comprise the council and police but there are ongoing discussions to see if other partners could join the hub in the future.

The various agencies involved are now looking at how they respond to anti-social behaviour to draw up a new, more efficient way of working to make the best use of joint resources.

The Mansfield Community Partnership is also engaged in a project to better understand what strengths various local communities have and how the hub can support them in tackling crime and anti-social behaviour.

The move to a shared resource follows a national trend and there are other similar successful partnership hubs already in Nottinghamshire.



Making Mansfield a safer and more

leasant lace

New rules will come into force in Mansfield next month which are aimed at making the town a safer and more pleasant place to live in, work in and visit.

rom 1 August, the new rules will aim to deter issues such as smoking in children's play areas, cycling through the pedestrianised town centre and the use of and sale of "legal highs" (drugs that are now illegal).

The new rules, which come under a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) will build on existing orders which are currently in force in the Mansfield district.

The existing orders cover issues such as dog control, dog fouling. preventing the consumption of alcohol in designated public places and ordering the dispersal of groups in certain areas.

The new powers will enable authorised council staff to:


- Disperse groups if they are causing (or are likely to cause) nuisance, alarm, harassment or distress to any other person in the town centre (including Commercial Gate and Titchfield Park) and Nottingham Road Leisure Park:
- Prohibit urinating, defecating and spitting in any public place in the district:

Require anyone walking a dog to have the means to pick up dog

Prohibit the use, sale or supply of psychoactive substances and new, now illegal, drugs (formerly known as legal highs).

The changes mean residents will be seeing new signs going up around the town warning them of the new powers and offences.

People who flout the new rules could be handed a £100 fixed penalty notice and up to a £1,000 fine if the case goes to court, but there will be a 'grace' period of three months when the police and authorised council officers will warn offenders rather than issuing a fine where new powers are being introduced.

Director for Communities Hayley Barsby said: "We want people to feel safe and secure in Mansfield which is the thinking behind these new powers.

"We believe the vast majority of people will be supportive of these measures and will abide by them"


