No rise in Council Tax for fifth year

Residents will not pay any more for district council services in 2015/16 after councillors voted to freeze Council Tax for a fifth consecutive year.

Work will begin to identify funding for a new wet and dry sports facility on land at Meden School, Warsop, after councillors agreed to set aside £8m in the four-year capital programme for the project.

The leisure centre would be funded through £327,000 of New Homes Bonus - a grant paid by central government to local councils for increasing the number of homes and their use. The remaining £7,673,000 would come from other currently unsecured funding such as partner contributions, grants and potential future New Homes Bonus money.

The council needed to find £3m-worth of savings to balance the budget in 2015/16 as a result of the continued reduction in government grants,



Bank Holiday bin collections

Planning for the future

Residents can be among the first to hear about plans for the future of Mansfield district by signing up to take part in a consultation.

The council's Planning Policy team is working on a new Local Plan, which is an important document that will shape how the district develops over the next 20 years.

Residents will have the opportunity to comment on the plan, which tackles key issues facing the district, during a six-week consultation later this year.

Smoking pledge

Mansfield District Council has signed up to the Nottinghamshire County and Nottingham City declaration on tobacco control.

This demonstrates our commitment to reduce smoking in our communities and secure the health, welfare, economic and environmental benefits that come from reduced smoking.

As part of our commitment, we advise businesses on complying with smokefree legislation and updating their smoking policies, and work with partners to tackle the sale of illegal tobacco products.

on-going reduction in income from property lettings due to the economic climate and low interest rates from investments.

The majority of the shortfall was found through the council's Change 2 review of existing services and structures, plus new income sources.

The budget and proposed capital programme are designed to meet the council's priorities while also minimising the impact on residents, the quality and quantity of services and staff.

There will be no increase in the majority of fees and charges including car parking, market rents and brown bin garden waste collections.

The budget also includes money set aside for the acquisition

of commercial properties to generate additional revenue income, works at the Civic Centre to release space for commercial letting to generate income and the formation of a housing company to build new homes within the district.

The council will receive a £59,000 Council Tax freeze grant from the government.

Join our Garden Waste Collection Service



It's not too late to join our 2015/16 Garden Waste Collection Service.

The new scheme starts on 1 April 2015. To guarantee receiving the service from the start date you had to subscribe by 13 March. However, there is still time to join. The annual cost is £25 even if you join partway through the year – so join as soon as possible to get the most out of the service.

Once your payment has cleared, you will receive a sticker within ten working days, which must be placed on your brown bin. Crews will not empty any bins, unless they are displaying a current sticker.

Residents who do not want the service, but still have a brown bin, are asked to call **01623 463463** and we will arrange for your brown bin to be taken away.

You will get a brown bin and an all year-round garden waste collection every two weeks from March to November and monthly from December to February.

You can use the bin to recycle:

- ✦ grass cuttings
- ✦ hedge trimmings
- ✦ leaves
- ✦ small branches and twigs, and
- ✦ plants, weeds and cut flowers.



Major development given the go ahead after lengthy legal battle



A judicial review into the proposed Lindhurst development has been dismissed by the Royal Courts of Justice in London.

Work is expected to start in the spring on the development of 169 hectares (417 acres) of land off the A617 Mansfield and Ashfield Regeneration Route.

Three previous applications for permission to appeal against the Lindhurst planning application were dismissed because the judge felt that there was no arguable case for a judicial review. Although a judicial review went ahead on the last occasion, the Court of Appeal's three judges dismissed the challenge on all grounds.

The development and the much-needed high quality family homes and employment opportunities it will bring are vital for the regeneration and growth of the entire district.

The plans include up to 1,700 new homes, as well as a new primary school, doctors' surgery, community centre, park and space for retail and business use.

Changes to the council's bank account

From 1 April 2015, Mansfield District Council will be transferring its corporate banking services.

The Co-operative Bank currently provides the Council's banking services but following a procurement process the Council has appointed Lloyds Bank to provide services.

If you pay using the following methods then you will not need to do anything as your payments will automatically transfer to the new bank account;

- Direct Debit
- Payments made using the Council's website or 24-hour automated payments line
- PayPoint
- Post Office

However, if you pay using the following methods you will need to change the bank details; the Council will not be able to do it for you.

- Standing Orders
- Online banking
- BACS

Wider spaces make life easier for motorists

Walkden Street multi-storey car park in Mansfield will have wider than standard spaces when it reopens following essential improvements.

Levels 1A and 1B will reopen on 30 March but the remaining levels 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B will remain closed until 27 April.

The work, which includes major structural repairs, waterproofing, redecoration and improved lighting, is the first phase of a £1.2m project.

There will be 381 spaces, which will all be the same width as standard parent/child spaces and bays for blue badge holders to make the

car park more family friendly. This will make them among the widest standard spaces in Nottinghamshire - perfect for families and larger vehicles such as vans and 4x4s.

The Council's Shopmobility service is operating from the Four Seasons multi-storey car park while the work takes place.

Mansfield goes to the polls

This elections supplement explains how each election works, why it's important to vote, what the various deadlines are for registering to vote and the different methods of voting.

Voters in Mansfield district will go to the polls to elect their Mayor, MP, Mansfield district councillors and Warsop parish councillors on Thursday 7 May.



Thursday
7 May

Elections timetable

Key dates between now and this year's elections are:

24 MARCH **24 March** The official start of the local elections period. Prospective local elections candidates can submit nomination papers from this date until 4pm on 9 April.

1 APRIL **1 April** The prospective Parliamentary election candidates can submit nomination papers from around this date until 4pm on 9 April.

9 APRIL **9 April (5pm)** Publication of persons nominated (the list of candidates) for Parliamentary election. For Mayoral, District and Parish council elections the list of candidates will be published by 4pm on 10 April.

20 APRIL **20 April** Deadline for receiving applications to register to vote.

21 APRIL **21 April (5pm)** Deadline for making new postal vote applications (including postal proxy applications) and for changes to existing postal or proxy votes. A proxy vote is where you give someone you trust official consent to vote on your behalf.

28 APRIL **28 April (5pm)** Deadline for making new applications to vote by proxy (except for medical emergencies or emergencies where a person has been called away as a result of their occupation, service or employment).

7 MAY **7 May (7am – 10pm)** Polling Day.

District Council elections

Mansfield District Council elections are held every four years.

As a voter it is your opportunity to decide who you want to elect to represent you and your community at Mansfield District Council.

A district councillor's job is to represent your views and make important decisions which have an impact on your community and the lives of everyone who lives there.

Mansfield District Council has adopted a single member ward system, which means there is just one councillor for each of the district's 36 wards.

In the district council election, electors are allowed to vote for one candidate.

The election uses the first-past-the-post system, which in simple terms means the candidate who receives the most votes is elected.

In the unlikely event of only one candidate being nominated to stand for election in a ward, that candidate will be automatically elected unopposed, without the need for a vote.



Parish council elections

Voters in Market Warsop, Church Warsop, Warsop Vale and Meden Vale, also have the opportunity to elect members to the Warsop Parish Council.

The Warsop parish is divided into four wards, with three seats in each ward. Electors are allowed to vote for up to three candidates. If three or less candidates are nominated in a particular ward, those candidates are automatically elected unopposed, without the need for a vote.



The Mayoral election

Mansfield District Council has had an elected Mayor since 2002 and this will be the district's fourth Mayoral election.

An elected Mayor is different to a traditional ceremonial Mayor or a Council Leader. The Mayor is elected by the people, while ceremonial Mayors and Council Leaders are elected by fellow councillors.

It is the elected Mayor's job to lead and represent the council and its residents locally and nationally. He or she has to make vital decisions about the council's priorities and services and how it spends its money.

It's also the Mayor's job to select a Cabinet made up of councillors to help him or her develop and implement those policies.

Mayoral candidate booklet

Every registered voter in the district will receive a copy of a booklet containing details of the Mayoral candidates.

Under the rules of the Mayoral election, the Returning Officer Ruth Marlow must provide the booklet, which will be delivered to homes around 15 April.

Voting at the Mayoral election

The supplementary voting system is used at the Mayoral election.

There are two columns on the ballot paper so you can vote for your first choice and second choice candidates, although making a second choice is not compulsory.

If one candidate gets more than half of the first choice votes, he or she will become Mayor.

If no candidate gets more than half the first choice votes, the two candidates with the most first choice votes will remain in the election and all the other candidates will be eliminated. The second choice votes of the eliminated candidates are then counted and any that have been cast for the two remaining candidates are added to their total. The candidate who has the highest overall total of votes is declared the Executive Mayor of Mansfield.

Parliamentary elections

On 7 May the public will vote for a Member of Parliament (MP) to represent Mansfield in the House of Commons. Parliamentary General elections are held every five years.

The UK is divided into 650 constituencies, each with one MP. You vote for one MP to sit in the UK Parliament in Westminster and represent your constituency.



The voting system

Each voter has one vote in the Mansfield constituency. The candidate with the most votes becomes the MP for that area. The voting system is called first-past-the-post.

Register to vote

There's not long left to register in time to have your say at the elections on Thursday 7 May.

If you are eligible to register to vote and are not on the voters register please register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote or contact the Electoral Services department on **01623 463345** for a paper application form. The deadline to register is Monday 20 April.

Those particularly at risk of missing the chance to vote are people who have moved house recently, and who mistakenly assume they are automatically registered at their new address because they pay Council Tax. The two processes are completely separate.

If you have turned 18 since the last elections, then ensure you are registered so you can take this opportunity to vote for the first time.



Polling stations

Changes have been made to some of the polling stations across the district.

It is vital that you check your polling card when it arrives to make sure you know where to cast your vote. The polling card will contain the location of your polling station and a map.

Polling stations will be open from 7am to 10pm on the day of the election.

Your Council Tax for 2015 / 2016



Mansfield District Council collects Council Tax in the district on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council, Mansfield District Council, Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner, Nottinghamshire Fire Authority and Warsop Parish Council. Along with Government grants and, in some cases, charges for services, Council Tax helps to pay for local services provided by these organisations.

The total Council Tax for Mansfield District residents will be formalised on 10 March when all the precepts, which are set by each individual organisation, are added together. Full details will be published on our website www.mansfield.gov.uk/counciltax after this date.

Council Tax is calculated by the Government's Valuation Office Agency (VOA) and is based on the price a property would have sold for in April 1991.

The vast majority of properties in Mansfield district – 26,561 out of a total of 47,851 – are in Band A, which is the lowest Council Tax band.

Reductions and discounts

Households with one adult occupier are entitled to a 25% discount.

If there are two or more adults in the household, you may still qualify for a discount if one of the occupiers:

- is a full-time student, student nurse or apprentice
- has a severe learning disability
- is a young adult who is still eligible for child benefit, or
- is a full-time carer looking after someone.

This list is not comprehensive so please contact **01623 463463** for more information.

The amount of discount we give on empty properties is changing from 1

April. A discount of 75% will apply for the first three months instead of the current six months on empty properties that are substantially unfurnished.

Owners of properties that have been empty for two years or more will have to pay a premium of 50% on top of their full Council Tax.

If your household includes a person with a disability you may be entitled to an adjustment on your Council Tax valuation band. If your home is already in the lowest band, you will still get a reduction.


Road names mark First World War centenary

New road names have been agreed for the 64-unit extra care scheme in the Brownlow Road and Bould Street area of Mansfield.

As work on the development started in August 2014 - the centenary of the start of the First World War - it seemed fitting to name the streets in tribute.

Brownlow Road will no longer exist and Bould Street will become Centenary Road. The roads off Centenary Road within the development will be known as Flanders Close, Liberty Close and Foresters Close. The ten bungalows for people with low-level dementia are in a courtyard, which will be known as Poppy Court.

The scheme includes ten properties - five two-bedroom bungalows and five two-bedroom houses - which will be sold for Older Persons Shared Ownership.



These are for people who have extra care needs and will be advertised for sale within the next few months. Could improvements help you to live more independently?

In the past six months, 46 private homeowners across the district have had their homes adapted to allow them to live independently, thanks to a grant from Mansfield District Council.

Disabled Facilities Grants (DFGs) help to pay for essential adaptations to make it easier for disabled residents to get into and around their home, make their home safer, make it easier to use the bathroom and kitchen and to adapt heating and lighting.

DFGs can be used to provide equipment such as stair-lifts, ceiling track hoists, through floor lifts, accessible shower facilities and wash and dry toilets.

To be eligible for a grant a resident must:

- be disabled,
- either own their own home or rent from a private landlord or housing association,
- have difficulty managing daily living tasks, and
- be assessed by an Occupational Therapist as having a need.

If they live in Council-owned or housing association property they may still be able to get adaptations to their home subject to an Occupational Therapy assessment, but they may be funded differently.

If disabled residents think they would benefit from a DFG they should contact Nottinghamshire County Council's Occupational Therapy (OT) service on **0300 500 8080**.

The OT service will assess their needs and may recommend what equipment and/or adaptations are required. If a DFG is needed, the OT service will inform Mansfield District Council of the work that is necessary. The District Council's Strategic Housing service will then consider the application.

A financial assessment will be carried out to see what, if any, contribution should be made by the resident.

A development of 17 new bungalows for rent has started at Flint Avenue in Forest Town.


