You can make all sorts of council payments at a time that suits you, whether on a computer or phone via the council's 24-hour secure payments service. The site accepts most major payment cards. Debit cards incur no charge but there is a 2% charge for payments by credit card.

Among the payments you can make online are:

- council tax
- business rates
- sundry income invoices (including garden waste)
- housing rent
- garage rent
- payments to Mansfield BID
- Fixed Penalty Notices.

These payments can also be made on the council's 24-hour payment line **01623 428632**. Have your payment card and reference number ready when you call.

# The Tour of B 2017 comes to

Nottinghamshire will host an entire stage of the OVO Energy Tour of Britain 2017 on 6 September and the starting point will be right here in Mansfield!

n the day you'll see 120 of the world's top cyclists set off from Market Place and weave six kilometres around the town before heading out towards Ashfield.

The 175 kilometre race will pass through Eastwood, Hucknall, Gedling,

Mansfield will be the starting point for the fourth stage of the Tour of Britain and the Market Place will be home to the ToB race village where residents and visitors will be able to meet the cyclists and discover more about the country's biggest free-to-watch event.

The cyclists will set off from the Market Place after 10.30am and head up Leeming Street, north along Chesterfield Road past Tesco before turning left at the Civic Centre. They will then continue along Rosemary Street past the old Bus Station, past the Stags' football ground, Titchfield Park and Mansfield Leisure Park on Nottingham Road.

They will turn right at High Oakham Primary School and continue up Atkin Lane and Sheepbridge Lane before turning left on to the A38 near the Sir John Cockle pub and joining the Ashfield section of the race at King's Mill Hospital.

Over the coming weeks we'll be advising spectators on the best allocated places to watch from. There'll be more information on our dedicated ToB hub www.mansfield.gov.uk/ToB2017.

# Ensure your bin is safe buy from us

Need a bin? Mansfield residents are advised to buy a wheelie bin only from the council to be certain it meets its safety specifications and will be emptied.

> Non-council bins can pose safety risks to the public and staff

esidents are responsible for buying a replacement bin if theirs is lost or stolen or sometimes if they move into a new home and a bin has not been provided by the developer.

But some householders are buying bins from regular retailers, which can pose safety risks.

Often they are made from a lower grade of plastic which can buckle under pressure or are not compatible with the lifting gear on bin lorries. This means bins, weighing up to 50kg, can fall off as they are being emptied, posing a risk to staff and the public.

Now, where bin crews come across a non-council bin, they will empty it once and leave a tag on the bin advising the householder that it does not meet specifications and will not be emptied again until it is replaced.



The council will replace council supplied bins for free if they are damaged beyond repair while being emptied. Damaged bins are mended wherever possible and should be reported via the council's website.

To avoid bin thefts residents should mark their bins with their house number and address.

Details of the council's bin specifications are available by emailing **mdc@mansfield.gov.uk** or calling **01623 463463**.

#### Sign up to the Garden Waste service

The council's Garden Waste collection service is now up and running.

Fortnightly collections run from March to November with monthly collections from December to February. U. POST

Brown bins can be used for:

- grass cuttings
- hedge trimmings
- leaves
- small branches and twigs
- plants
- weeds
- cut flowers.

The year-round service costs £30 a year and £15 extra for each additional brown bin up to a maximum of four. It starts in April each year and costs the same regardless of when people sign up.

# Bank holiday bin collections

Bin collections will run as normal during the August bank holiday. Bins should be put out for collection at the usual time. Crews can't return if bins haven't been put out on time.

# Dozen prosecuted over illegal waste disposal

Mansfield District Council has successfully prosecuted 12 offenders on charges connected to the illegal disposal of waste so far this year.

Itogether they have been ordered to pay more than £5,500 in fines and costs. Five admitted charges of failing in their duty of care to ensure waste is disposed of correctly and seven admitted the more serious charge of fly-tipping.

In addition to the prosecutions, 15 people have been issued with £200 Fixed Penalty Notices for fly tipping small quantities of waste.

New figures show 1,612 fly tipping incidents were cleared by the council in 2016/17, up from 1,335 in 2015/16, an increase of 20%.

The cost of dealing with the problem increased from  $\pounds 64,338$  in 2015/16 to  $\pounds 76,365$  in 2016/17, an increase of 18.5%.

If a third party, such as a builder or waste collector, is removing your waste, ensure you:

- check they are a licensed waste carrier
- keep a note of their details and get a receipt.

**YOU** could be prosecuted if they later dump your waste.



Contaminated recyclable waste is a growing problem in the district and you can help by using your blue recycling bin responsibly.

The district council collected 7,225 tonnes of waste from blue recycling bins in 2016/17. Of this, around 20% (1,445 tonnes) was non-recyclable waste that was wrongly placed in recycling bins.

This means Mansfield has the highest rate of contaminated recycling of any district in the county.

The danger is that if a contaminated recycling bin is emptied into the bin lorry, the entire load could be rejected by the Veolia recycling centre and the council could incur a landfill tax of £100 per tonne.

The council aims to reduce its contamination rate to 5%, which is the county's tolerance level. But it can only achieve this target with your help.

The most common items that are wrongly put in recycling bins are:

- plastic bags
- nappies
- glass

A housing scheme in Mansfield, which helps to reduce "bed blocking" at King's Mill Hospital in Sutton-in-Ashfield, has won a prestigious national award.

etween October 2014 and January 2017, the Better Together – ASSIST Hospital Discharge Scheme helped 2,174 patients and saved the NHS more than £1.3m a year by freeing up beds. It saves an average of 4.5 bed days per patient - a saving of £936 per patient.

Its significance has now been recognised in the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) Shared Learning Awards 2017.

The scheme is a collaboration of teams from Mansfield District Council, Nottinghamshire County Council, Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Newark and Sherwood Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and Mansfield and Ashfield CCG.

It involves social care and health workers identifying patients at King's Mill Hospital who have a housing or social need and working with the district council's housing department to find solutions that enable these patients to leave hospital.

The project was described by NICE as "particularly impressive" among 60 other entries of an "extremely high" standard.

Last year, the ASSIST (Advocacy, Sustainment, Supporting Independence, Safeguarding Team) hospital discharge project made the finals of the health and social care category of the Local Government Chronicle awards. It was also shortlisted for the Association for Public Service Excellence Annual Service Awards in 2015 in the Best Health and Wellbeing Initiative category.

Help to Buy is a government scheme that provides a range of home ownership options designed to make it more affordable for people to buy their own home.

Help to Buy Midlands is the government's agent for the entire midlands area and can guide you through the home buying process and help you get a foot on the property ladder.

Many developers and housing associations advertise their properties on the website and there are a range of different options and products available to suit all needs.

## Grants available to help independent living

Over the past 14 months 73 private homeowners across Mansfield district have had their homes adapted to allow them to live independently, thanks to a grant from Mansfield District Council.

Disabled Facilities Grants (DFGs) help to pay for essential adaptations to make it easier for the most vulnerable disabled residents to get into and around their home.

Adaptations can include stair-lifts, ceiling track hoists, through floor lifts,

accessible shower facilities, and wash and dry toilets.

To be eligible, a resident must:

- be disabled
- own their own home or rent from a private landlord or housing association
- have difficulty managing daily living tasks
- be assessed by an Occupational Therapist as having a need.

# Swim for less than the cost of a coffee

Do you want to be more active but think you can't afford to use the leisure centres? If you get a Leisure Discount Card or Leisure Bonus Card, it entitles you to a raft of savings.

ith a Leisure Discount Card, adults can swim from £3.40 and with a Leisure Bonus Card, juniors and over-60s can swim from

just £1.55 – less than the average cost of a cup of coffee. A fitness session can cost as little as £2.95 for adults.

A Leisure Bonus Card is available to anyone who lives in Mansfield and receives benefits such as JSA, ESA, Incapacity Benefit, disability benefits or Working Tax Credits, are over 60 or a full-time student over 16. The card costs 50p for six months and allows up to 50% The Leisure Discount Card is available to everyone and costs £1 a year. This entitles you to save £1 on some activities.
