Customer portal

The council will launch a new sign-in customer portal to improve access to online services in spring 2018.

he system has been built in-house to encourage more residents to self-serve and do more online transactions with the authority.

The portal is one of the first major developments emerging from the council's Digital Transformation Strategy. It will be available from the homepage www.mansfield.gov.uk and all online customers will be encouraged to set up and access an account every time they visit.

The benefit of creating an account is tailored content. Your account will contain all the information you need including bin collection days. ward councillor details, Council Tax information and in the future you will be able to see your balances.

> amounts in one place. The portal facilitates direct interaction with teams delivering frontline services and allows customers to get real time feedback

and progress reports on their

enquiries and reported items.

If, for example, you reported a case to the Community Safety team you will see a record of your report, the action that has been taken and what happens next.

The portal also hosts improved online payment, reporting and application forms and a new information page on popular planning matters.

Last chance to have say on planning blueprint

Residents have until 5pm on Friday 10 November to comment on a planning blueprint for the district which will quide the development of homes and business premises until 2033.

As part of a process to implement the next Mansfield District Local Plan, the public have been commenting on the Preferred Options document.

The final two in a series of exhibitions will take place at the i-Centre, Hamilton Way, Mansfield, on Tuesday 7 November from 9am to 2pm, and at Oak Tree Leisure Centre on Thursday 9 November from 2pm to 6pm.

The guickest and easiest way to comment is at http://mansfield.objective.co.uk/ portal/mdlp.

Once the council has considered comments received during the consultation, the next stage of the process is to publish a Publication Draft Local Plan. A statement will also be published to explain how comments from the public have been taken into account.

Once the Publication Draft Local Plan is published there will be one final chance to comment - but only on the 'soundness' of the Local Plan. It will then be submitted to the Secretary of State, along with the comments made on the document and be considered by an independent planning inspector. Once approved, it will then be adopted by council.

Reception work at the Civic Centre

As the council makes way for a shared customer hub with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), the reception and central mall area at Civic Centre will be temporarily changed to allow for building work. Services will not be affected but access to the building will change for a few months.

From mid-January to May 2018 there will be a temporary reception in the Council Chamber. Customers will have access to Housing, Revenues and Benefits and central reception teams five days a week. The temporary reception will be accessible from the Rosemary

Street entrance and the main car park.

From April next year the DWP will operate its Job Centre and other support services from the Civic Centre and our shared hub will be ready for use in the early summer. The hub will provide a one-stop shop for all benefit applications, advice and support including Universal Credit, housing benefits and Council Tax.

Customers will be encouraged to self-serve from the IT suite which will have full access to council and DWP online systems. There'll be staff on hand to help and the opportunity for one-to-one support when it is needed.

remembering a few things as you're getting ready.

Take care with your travel arrangements this Christmas and New Year. Always book taxis in good time and make sure you know which taxi will be taking you home after a night out. It's a good idea to take the phone numbers for a few taxi firms with you if you don't want to book in advance.

Mansfield District Council runs stringent checks on vehicles before they can be licensed and drivers undergo detailed assessments to ensure they are fit and proper. All taxis must be licensed, but if you want to be sure that your taxi knows the local area, use one that's licensed by the council.


Personal safety

Cards and wrapping paper

Christmas cards, wrapping paper and envelopes can be recycled as long as they don't have foil, glitter or a shiny coating.

If in doubt, test wrapping paper with the 'scrunch test' - if you literally scrunch the paper in your hand and it stays in a ball, it can be put in the recycling bin.

Please remove all ribbons, bows and sticky tape.

Aerosols, cans and plastic bottles

All sorts of aerosol cans can be recycled including fake snow, de-icer, squirty cream, air freshener, deodorant, silly string, hairspray, furniture polish and dry shampoo. Just make sure they are empty - and please remove the lid.

Clean food and drinks cans, household cleaning product plastic bottles (bleach bottles), shampoo bottles, margarine tubs, yoghurt pots and vitamin bottles can all go in your blue recycling bin.

Plastic and foil food trays

These all go in your general rubbish bin - even if they are clean.

Christmas trees

Both real and artificial trees should be taken to your nearest recycling centre.

Waste food

You can compost vegetable and fruit peelings. teabags and egg shells. Do not compost cooked food, meat or fish. If you do not have a compost bin, all food waste should go in your green general waste bin.

Glass bottles and jars

Please take these to your local bottle bank or recycling centre.

Batteries

All household batteries can be recycled. Most shops that sell batteries and large supermarkets have collection containers

Christmas fairy lights

Old lights that no longer work should be taken to your local recycling centre.

Clothes

Old clothes and textiles can be donated to charity shops – some even have door-to-door bag collections. Alternatively, take them to your local textile bank or recycling centre.

Remember

Plastic bags, nappies, polystyrene, ice cream tubs, clingfilm, bubble wrap and bottle tops must all go in the green general waste bin.

Tovs

Unwanted toys that are in good condition can be sold online or donated to a charity shop. If they are broken, please put them in your general waste bin. If they contain batteries, please take them to your local recycling centre.

Recycling centres

Nottinghamshire County Council has 12 recycling centres. They are open every day in December and January from 8am to 4pm except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day, when they are closed.

Nothing beats being healthy

Photographer Michelle Howard, 35, of Mansfield, has lost eight stone and discovered a love for exercise since starting her fitness journey nearly two years ago.

She trains in the gym and swims at Water Meadows Swimming and Fitness Complex as well as doing boxing and circuit training at Body and Soul gym in Handley Arcade.

I weighed 18 stone and couldn't exercise. I didn't feel healthy and struggled to keep up with my two kids.

We learned to cook everything from scratch, ate healthily and started exercising.

For the first four months all I did was walk and then I taught myself to swim and went twice a

When I went for my gym induction I had this pre-conceived idea about the people that go to the gym. But when I went in it was people like me - of all different shapes and sizes.

No matter what size you are, you can do something. Do a small amount every day and the next day aim to move a bit more than you did yesterday.

Nothing beats the feeling of being healthy on the inside. I could never go back to how I was before.

Exercise has changed my life



Julie Bodin, Business **Transformation Officer** at Mansfield District Council, tells how CrossFit changed her life.

I joined CrossFit Hexis in February 2016 after being badgered by my friend to give it a go. The first session nearly killed me, but I decided to go back and soon became hooked.

After just three months, I entered an in-house competition and was able to keep up with people who had been going for over a year. Later that summer, I came 122nd out of over 350 women in the UK in an annual worldwide competition. These were massive achievements for me

It has changed my life for the better!



I was relatively unfit when I started and have a long-term joint condition which limits movement and requires regular pain relief. But the coaches have worked with me to help improve my condition and I've been almost pain-free for the majority of this year. I am also fitter, healthier and wear smaller sized clothing.

Being unfit or having health conditions should not put you off exercise. It has changed my life for the better!






