Christmas bin collections & spread the word!*

If your usual green bin day is Tuesday 25 December, it will be emptied on Saturday 22

December.

If your usual green bin day is Wednesday 26 December, it will be emptied on Saturday 29 December. If your usual blue bin day is Tuesday 1 January, it will be emptied on Saturday 5 January.

We will **not** be supplying printed stickers of Christmas collection arrangements for your bin so please make a note of the changes and make sure all your family, friends and neighbours are aware.

Top bin tips

We do all we can to empty your bin on your scheduled day but please help us by making sure your bins are out by 6.30am.

We will take small amounts of side waste on blue bin days but it must be in cardboard boxes or paper bags and not be contaminated. We are unable to take side waste on green bin days.

To recycle excess waste, please use the county council's recycling centres, or the bring sites, which include glass banks and clothes bins in car parks across the district.

If we can't empty your bin, for example due to severe weather, please leave it out and we will come back to it as soon as we can.

MAMBA CRACKDOWN SEES RESULTS

A joint operation to tackle antisocial behaviour (ASB) related to the use of the drug Mamba is making a positive difference in Mansfield town centre.

e are working with partners including Nottinghamshire Police and Framework to deal with this complex issue, which towns and cities across the country are also experiencing.

We are committed to tackling the root causes of homelessness, breaking the cycle of dependency on drugs and alcohol and encouraging users to change their lifestyles to lead more productive lives.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Mamba-related antisocial behaviour in Mansfield town centre is our number one community safety priority.

A dedicated taskforce including Neighbourhood Wardens and Antisocial Behaviour Officers use all available enforcement powers to minimise the impact on our town.

Three Outreach Workers specialising in homelessness, mental health and substance misuse to provide support for individuals to turn their lives around. Even if their help is turned down, Outreach Workers continue to build relationships with and offer help to those affected.

We are working with Mansfield Homeless Network - including local soup kitchens, Change Grow Live (CGL) and the local NHS.

Our winter night shelter will be open seven nights a week from 1 December to the end of February thanks to Framework, Derby City Mission and local churches.

There are more police officers working in the Town Centre than ever before - one sergeant, six constables and six PCSOs are working closely with the council's Neighbourhood Wardens, Antisocial Behaviour officers, CCTV and Legal teams.

From 1 June to 13 October, there have been 56 arrests and 42 Direction to Leave Notices issued.

We are constantly checking we are doing everything possible and learning from projects in other areas. More than 50 people shared their experiences at a recent Mamba seminar.

Inspector Nick Butler said: "Although Mansfield town centre is safe statistically. we understand how people feel when they see people suffering the effects of drugs.

"The College of Policing says Mansfield is leading the way and other police areas are coming to study our approach.

"I am very proud of our partnership approach. We are getting people off drugs and leading more productive lives and ensuring that the town is a happy and vibrant place.

"Mamba, rough sleeping and ASB remain a priority and we'll continue to act on information to get positive results."

Hayley Barsby, the council's Chief **Executive, said: "We can't stress how** seriously we are taking this issue as we understand the impact it is having on residents, businesses, market traders and visitors.

"We have helped a number of people with complex needs turn their lives around and we are confident that we can continue this by working closely with other organisations.

"However, this isn't something that'll be resolved overnight. We'd ask people to be patient and do everything they can to support us and our partners."





Former Mamba user John, who is 28, slept in a tent for six months before the council's Street Outreach team helped him to get off the streets.

He's now in his own home and says the best thing is sleeping in a proper, warm bed, having hot water and being able to shave when he wants. John's in the process of regaining custody of his young son.

John said he was grateful for all the help and support he'd received from the council and its partners.

He said Mamba was incredibly cheap, highly addictive and dangerous.

When asked what could be done to encourage more people to accept the help on offer, he said: "People like me. If I can do it, they can surely do it."

Work set to start on **£1.4m** Old Town Hall revamp



Work on revamping the Old Town Hall to provide new shops and offices is expected to be complete by the spring next year.

The £1.4m project is part of the council's strategy to encourage Mansfield to be seen as a destination for visitors, shoppers and businesses looking to invest in the district. It is hoped it will create 20 new employment opportunities and encourage employers to set up in the town centre.

The scheme involves bringing the Grade II* listed building back into full use for the first time in more than 30 years by creating three retail units in a shared space on the ground floor with two fully refurbished medium sized offices on the first floor towards the rear of the building.

In addition, two existing retail units at the side of the hall will be redeveloped and the old Council Chamber at the front of the building on the first floor will be refurbished. Ideas being considered for the chamber include making it available to hire for functions, business use or weddings.

There will be no significant changes to the exterior of the building to preserve the historic character of the property.

The council is contributing £775,000 towards the scheme. The remaining funding is being delivered by the D2N2 Local Enterprise Partnership as part of the £8m N2 Town Centres Programme.

Work was due to start on the project as My Mansfield was going to print in October.

The residents of Mansfield District Council's flagship £8.5m housing project, Town View, will soon be moving into their new homes.

total of 54 apartments and bungalows for the over-55s have been built on the site of the former General Hospital in Mansfield which was derelict for about 20 years before the council bought it for redevelopment.

Six of the 12 two-bedroom bungalows built already have potential buyers in a shared ownership scheme.

Tenants for the other six bungalows and the 42 one-bedroom and twobedroom apartments have already been allocated through the council's Homefinder services and through Nottinghamshire County Council for tenants with extra care needs.

As My Mansfield went to print, work

was due to start on landscaping the site around a village green complete with outdoor fitness equipment. The apartments will also offer communal facilities, such as a lounge, a dining room and an outdoor terraced area.

Sarah Troman, Director of Communities, said: "We are very excited that this project will soon be complete. It really has transformed this derelict piece of land, providing muchneeded specialist housing for older residents."

The scheme began on site in August 2016 as part of Mansfield District Council's Local Plan to deliver new homes, employment, commercial and community facilities.

Landmark memorial to get a facelift thanks to the National Lottery

One of Mansfield's most well-known landmarks, the Bentinck Memorial in the Market Place, is set to have a facelift before the end of the year thanks to money raised by National Lottery players.

t is all part of Mansfield Townscape Heritage Project, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to improve key buildings in parts of the town centre after Mansfield District Council

successfully bid for nearly £850,000 worth of HLF grants.

Businesses in the project area, covering parts of Leeming Street, the Market Place and Stockwell Gate, are also set to be

offered free gutter cleaning in the coming months as part of the scheme.

From January, the owners of identified properties in the project area will be able to apply for match-funded grants of 75% to help with the cost of making property improvements in sympathy with their heritage. Those who rent premises should encourage their landlords to apply for the improvement grants.

The project is part of the council's overall vision to regenerate the town centre and make the district vibrant and attractive to residents, visitors and businesses looking for a place to invest.



As well as improvements to buildings, the scheme is expected to offer work experience opportunities for students and volunteers to learn about conservation and restoration skills.

There should also be opportunities to be involved in film, storytelling, street theatre, art and photography activities, celebrating efforts to return one of Mansfield's most elegant shopping streets to its former glory.

Looking ahead...

£21.4m plan for new council homes

We recently pledged £21.4m to build more than 100 new council homes over the next five years.

Council-owned land and buildings suitable for conversion into homes have been identified and work will start subject to approvals.

The overall cost of the schemes includes providing vital infrastructure, such as drainage, roads, footpaths,

lighting and landscaping, as well as cleaning any contaminated land. All potential suppliers go through a strict competitive process to ensure that the council achieves the best price and quality.

The proposed schemes comprise ten homes in Rosemary Avenue, 22 at Newark Way, Newark Close and Newark Drive; 36 at Bellamy Road, 12 apartments at Rock Court, 30 apartments for over-55s in Sandy Lane and 18 affordable homes for rent in Centenary Road.

This is in addition to refurbishing eight flats on Shireoaks to bring them back into use, and the conversion of two tenant meeting rooms to provide family accommodation and a specially adapted property for a disabled tenant.

Tour of Britcin puts Mansfield on the map

What a day for Mansfield! Thousands lined the streets to welcome more than 100 of the world's top cyclists for the second year in a row as the district hosted the Tour of Britain.



ain failed to dampen the electric atmosphere outside the Civic Centre where spectators, many wearing Robin Hood hats, cheered Stage 7 winner lan Stannard over the finish line.

Other cycling stars in the 139-mile race included the eventual Tour of Britain 2018 winner Julian Alaphilippe and the biggest names in cycling Geraint Thomas and Chris Froome.

Earlier in the day, people had the opportunity to cycle across the finish line ahead of the professionals, while the Summer Festival Finale in Chesterfield Road Park featured free entertainment, live music, cyclingrelated activities and sports taster sessions. The event – the highest profile sporting event Mansfield has ever hosted and broadcast globally to millions – saw some 20,000 visitors in the district, boosting the local economy by an estimated £400,000.

Poppy display to crown Remembrance Day

Hundreds of people are expected to turn out for this year's Remembrance Sunday parade in Mansfield which marks 100 years to the day since the end of the First World War.

t will start with a wreath-laying ceremony at the war memorial outside the Civic Centre at 10am on Sunday 11 November.

Veterans, civic dignitaries and uniformed organisations will then make their way along Chesterfield Road, West Gate, Market Place and Church Street to St Peter and St Paul's Church for a memorial service at 10.55am.

After the service, the procession will

head back to the Market Place where there will be a military salute at about noon in front of the Old Town Hall, which will be decorated with a display of more than 15,000 knitted poppies. Poppy decorations will also adorn part of the parade route.
