
# **ML28 Penniment Lane Urban Fringe Farmlands**





**Regional Character Area: Limestone Farmlands** 

CONTEXT

## CHARACTERISTIC FEATURES

## Landform and hydrology

- A flat strip of land which is bordered on the east side by urban development
- A small pond is present close to the urban fringe surrounded by grassland and trees

## <u>Landuse</u>

- A semi-rural character with farms and woodlands, influenced by the urban fringe which is always visible
- Land use is mostly pasture farming, with some arable in the centre and pockets of informal and formal recreation land
- Fields immediately adjacent to the urban edge have, in some cases, been changed into amenity and recreation open spaces for the local residents, although some fields have been left to become scrubby through lack of use and some are now used by local residents for informal recreation
- Land to the south provides open land which maintains a semi-rural separation between Sutton in Ashfield and Mansfield
- A regular field pattern of medium scale arable fields of geometric shape; pasture fields are smaller particularly to the north and south where the field enclosure pattern is older
- Fields are bounded by fragmented hedgerows with scattered hedgerow trees in variable conditions. Hedgerows are generally well maintained, although closer to the urban fringe have either been left to become mature or are low or absent

## Landscape Features

- Hedgerow trees where present give a linear character and provide a limited amount of screening to the urban edge
- Woodland blocks are sparse throughout the area and generally concentrated in informal open space and small linear strip close to Romsey Place
- Tree groups are generally clustered along the urban fringe
- Areas of neutral grassland present both within the southern and northern parts of this LPZ Built Form
- The urban edge of Mansfield consists of modern residential properties, in red brick with red roofs. It is almost always visible as a uniform, well defined edge

## Views

- Views are contained by the urban fringe, although longer views are possible to the west across arable farmland
- Views from the south west corner are over a long distance as the landforms falls to the newly built hospital and industrial development on lower ground nestled in woodland. Farmland rises further beyond over industrial development

## **Other Features**

 An A road travels across the south east corner the area, connecting the A38 to the A617 and forming the west boundary beyond which the landscape becomes more rural and open



LANDSCAPE ANALYSIS	
Condition	
A flat and gently undulating landscape with a strong urban fringe influence. Characterised by mainly pasture and some arable farming, with very little woodland, and infrequent hedgerow trees. The LPZ is on flat land surrounded by urban development to the south and east	
Field pattern is mostly regular, medium scale arable to small pasture fields, rough grassland and amenity. Most are of modern origin although older patterns are present to the north and south.	ML028C
Woodland across the area is very limited, to a single linear belt and scattered trees in open space. Fields are bounded by hedgerows and although these are fragmented in parts, in places they are closely clipped with few hedgerow trees and in other places left to mature and contain clusters of mature trees increasing the sense of enclosure. Amenity recreation spaces are present close to the urban fringe and include sports pitches, children's play equipment and informal grassland and woodland areas. Some fields are under used and have become scrubby and in places overgrown.	ML028D
The landscape condition is considered to be <b>MODERATE</b> . Whilst in places the area is well maintained, such as the amenity areas close the urban edge, the hedgerows across the wider area, have become fragmented or become overgrown. Some fields close to the urban edge have been left unused and allowed to become scrubby, with overgrown mature edges. Field pattern is still evident but being eroded where hedgerows are in decline.
