Condition to be amended.

Condition 1 under Protection of Children from Harm to be amended to:

"Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 22:00 hours unless attending a pre-booked function or dining with an adult."

Non Standard Timing

To remove the non standard timing restriction in relation to all licensable activities undertaken on Christmas Day so as to allow the premises to operate to the same hours as generally permitted under the terms of the Licence.
